

A QUICK WAY TO DARN.

Darning stockings often becomes a problem when the holes are large. It is sometimes better to patch them as follows: Place over the darning egg a piece of discarded stocking and hold it firmly with your left hand. Now slip the torn stocking over this, let the weave of the stocking run in the same direction as the part you hold over the wooden egg, cut the raw edges from the hole and sew to the covered egg.

Use silk, as this does not cut the weave. Now remove, turn and trim away the patch all but one-half to one inch. Slip over the egg again and sew the edges firmly to the stocking. A little pressing will quickly finish this other-

wise tedious job, and the patch will not hurt even a tender foot.

CRETONNE BEDROOM PILLOWS.

The newest bedroom pillows are made of cretonne, either to match the hangings, or, if one prefers, to form a pleasing contrast. The pillow should be made in box shape before it is covered. Cut two squares of twenty inches and join the bottom with a three-inch strip of the goods. Then cover the cushion with cretonne, top, bottom and four sides, all of the seams being on the outside. Bind seams with a tape and finish with tassels at the corners.

A dainty nap pillow is made of the same cretonne pattern, but oblong in shape, the cretonne cover-

ed with a coarse net ruffle. A tiny rose pillow, made of rose-sprigged dainty eight inches square and filled with rose leaves, is a delight to tuck under the head, and imparts a pleasing freshness to the room.

JUDGMENT GIVEN
IN RAILWAY CASE

Ottawa, Jan. 24.—Mr. Justice Cassels handed down an opinion today in the matter of the valuating of the Quebec, Montmorency and Charlevoix Railway, the Quebec and Saguenay railway, and the Lotbiniere and Megantic railroad, referred to the Exchequer Court of Canada by Parliament last session.

Judge Cassels, by his reasons handed down today, merely expresses his views of the legal points arising in the valuation, and suggests that an appeal be taken to the Supreme Court, if the parties so desire, before evidence that would be admissible under his rulings is taken.

The probable amount to be deducted from the cost of the railways as put forward in their statement, will be some \$3,542,598 under Judge Cassel's ruling.

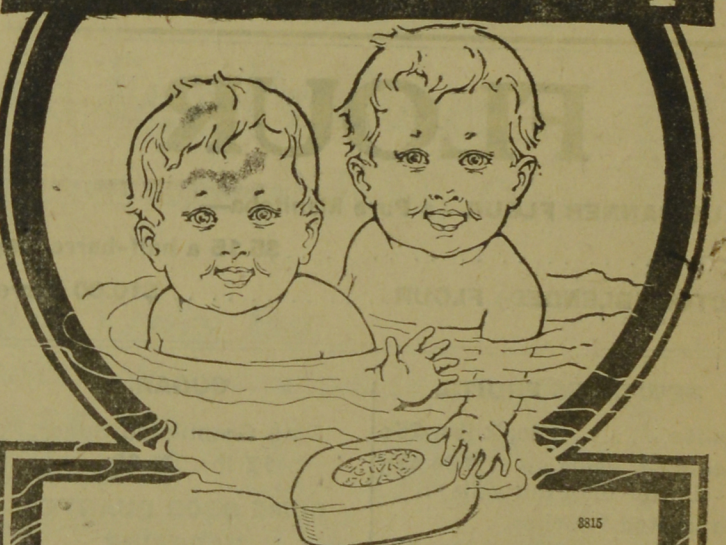
