### ENGLISH SEAPORTS BOMBARDED.

German Destroyers Again Cross the English Channel.

London, Feb. 26.—German destroyers bombarded Broadstairs and Margate early this morning. One woman and one child were killed and two persons were injured. Two houses were damaged.

This announcement was made in the House of Commons today by Sir Edward Carson, First Lord of the Admiralty.

Sir Edward Carson said that one of four British torpedo boat destroyers on patrol duty in the English Channel encountered several German destroyers, and a short engagement ensued. The British destroyer was not damaged. The German vessels were lost sight of, the First Lord said, but in the darkness another force of German destroyers bombarded the undefended ports of Broadstairs and Margate.

British light forces in the vicinity closed in on the German warships, which only remained a short time, he added and were gone before the approach of the British vessels.

### LIEUT. COL. C. J. MERSEREAU.

Will be on the Staff of the N. B. Brigade at St. John.

Lieut. Col. C. J. (Jack) Mersereau is to succeed Capt. A. D. Corelli on the staff of the New Brunswick Brigade command at St. John. This is the report which is current in military circles and seems to be well founded.

Lieut. Col. Mersereau will take over the training of the different units in New Brunswick. The military authorities feel that owing to the fact that so many units are in this province for short periods prior to going forward to England, that a man with overseas experience will be necessary to carry on the important duties in connection with their presence here. In addition to this, the embarkation department, recently inaugurated at New Brunswick headquarters, will demand the attention of Lieut. Col. Mersereau.

### Civic Contest Rumored.

A contest in the civic election of Monday, March 12th, is now rumored. Mr. Frank Lister took nomination papers out of the City Clerk's office this morning. It is understood that an effort is being made to produce opposition to Mayor Mitchell.

Altoona, Pa., Feb. 27.—Eighteen persons, seventeen passengers and a negro porter, were killed in a rear-end collision between an express train and a freight on the Pennsylvania railroad at Mount Union Station, 43 miles east of this city, early today. The accident occurred shortly after midnight and the bodies were so badly mangled that six hours later only nine had been identified.

Later information from Pennsylvania Railroad sources shows that twenty persons were killed in the wreck. It has been learned that in addition to those already accounted for two small children were killed. As no tickets were required for them they were overlooked when the passengers were checked up by the train crew.


parent purpose of the Act was that the liquor specifically named should be deemed conclusively to be intoxicating and evidence to show that they were in fact intoxicating should not be necessary and any evidence on the part of the defendant to show that they were non-intoxicating should not be admissible.

In regard to other liquors or beer, the question as to whether or not they are intoxicating within the meaning of the Act is entirely a question of fact to be proven to the satisfaction of the court by competent witnesses.

In this case the prosecution has shown by expert testimony that a bottle of beer obtained at the defendant's store contained 2.55 per cent. of alcohol, and no evidence as to whether or not the beer was intoxicating was offered by the prosecution, while the expert called by the prosecution, upon being asked, replied that he could not say that the beer in question was intoxicating (notwithstanding the fact that he stated that he had had twenty-five years experience as an analyst, and examined on an average 150 lots per year.) The defence called several witnesses who all stated that the beer in question was not intoxicating, and that it had no effect on them whatever, even when drunk in large quantities.

Upon the above I am asked to convict the defendant for keeping intoxicating liquor for sale. The fact that upon a chemical analysis alcohol was found in the beer, although it is competent evidence for the prosecution, does not necessarily or of itself prove that the beer was spirituous or malt, or that it would cause intoxication, so as to come within the meaning of the Act, because were the mere fact that a beer contained a certain percentage of alcohol sufficient to warrant a conviction on the ground that it was intoxicating, there would be no significance in the section of the Act, which names certain special liquors as intoxicating and places the burden on the prosecution to show that other liquors are intoxicating in fact.

And therefore the beer in question, not being of the nature specifically named as intoxicating under the Act, and no evidence having been offered by the prosecution that it was intoxicating in fact, I dismiss the complaint.
