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LIBERAL LETTER CAUSES PROTEST BY UNIONISTS

The notice of the convening of the local Liberal committee was as follows:

Fredericton, N. B., Nov. 22, 1917.
Dear Friend:

We are again starting a campaign for the people's rights—the right of franchise, the right to direct the affairs of this country. We start in under difficulties and discouragements. Our old enemy, the Tory, is as usual trying to trample on the rights of the Common People and as usual, by the cry of Loyalty and the waving of the Flag by which they are trying to deceive a number of our friends. I urge upon you then, to come to our meeting, and I assure you that you will find a serious, determined, Loyal spirit in our workers that was never there before, and it is this spirit that has shaken the masses of the true Canadians in this country that will smother the Profiteers on December 17th next.
