### CONTRACT PROMISED AND CAMPAIGN-FUND CONTRIBUTION GIVEN

Interesting Post-Election Story---Contractors Are Now Doing Some Guessing---Government Here For Another Meeting.

One of the interesting stories connected with the recent provincial election is that the Murray government promised the contract for the Centre-ville-Andover section of the St. John and Quebec Railway to a well known firm of contractors and then demanded a substantial contribution for campaign purposes. The contractors "came across," it is said, being told that the return of the government was a sure thing. Since election day they have been doing some hard thinking.

### NATIONAL LABOR BUREAU ADVOCATED FOR DOMINION

Miss St. John Wileman of Montreal In Fredericton in Interest of Proposed System--Interviewed Prominent Persons.

Miss St. John Wileman, of Montreal, is in Fredericton for the purpose of arousing public interest in the establishment of a National Labor Bureau system. The intention is to have such a bureau under the direction of the Department of Labor. With headquarters at Ottawa and branches in all parts of the Dominion, the Bureau would be constantly in touch with labor conditions and would be able to maintain a normal condition throughout Canada, preventing scarcity of labor in one section and a surplus in another.

Miss Wileman arrived here yesterday. Since her arrival in Fredericton she has interviewed His Honor the Lieut. Governor, His Worship Mayor Mitchell, Dr. C. C. Jones and officers of the Fredericton Labor Council.

Public men and public bodies are asked to memorialize the Dominion Government to establish such a system. It is urged that it will be of particular value after the war.

Miss Wileman goes from this city to St. John and Halifax.

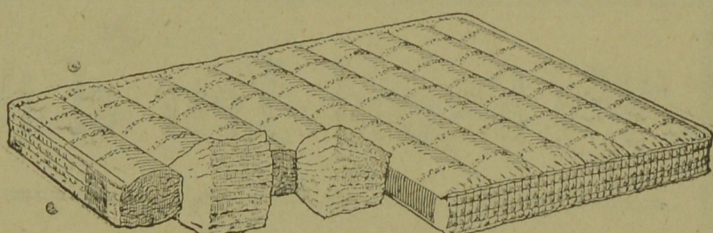

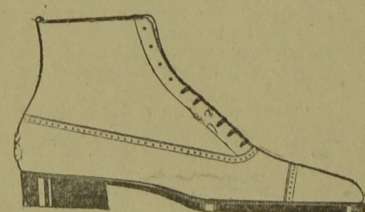
