SON-IN-LAW OF D. R. FORGAN KILLED IN WAR

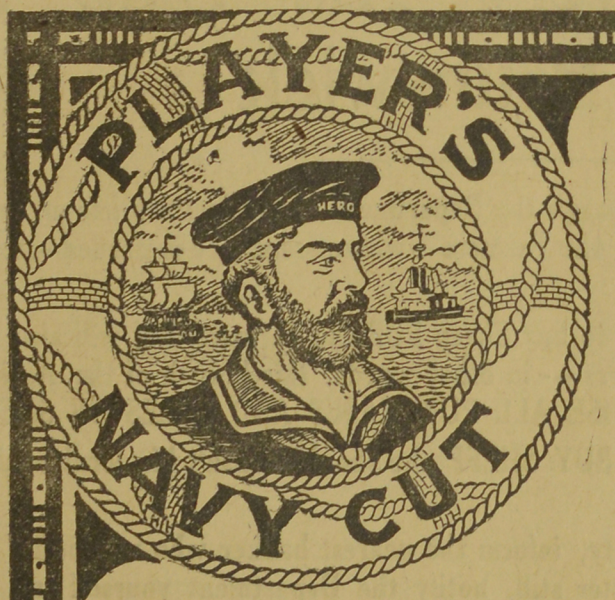

Poisoned machine gun bullets, subjected to a dose of kultur before being fired by a German airman, caused the death in a hospital near Paris of Sergeant W. Vernon Booth, Jr., of the Lafayette Escadrille. Sergt. Booth, a son-in-law of Mr. and Mrs. David R. Forgan, was married to Miss Ethel Forgan in June, when the flyer was in Paris on a furlough.

Just a simple cablegram from Mrs. Booth sent to her parents and to her husband's parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. Vernon Booth, Sr., New York, and to the young flyer's aunt, Mrs. P. A. Valentine, New York, told of the flyer's death. It read:

"Vernon died today."
Sergt. Booth was wounded on June 25 and forced to land. A bullet shattered a leg and despite amputation German poison in the coating of the bullet did its work. He was taken to the Scotch Women's Hospital, thirty miles from Paris, where he remained until his death. His bride was with him often, as she was doing Red Cross work in Paris and was allowed to visit the wounded flyer.

(Mr. Forgan was at one time manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia in this city and will be remembered by the older citizens. Mrs. Booth, who has just lost her husband, was born here.)
