


Fried Onions.

Slice onions, put in frying pan, half ill it with cold water and cook about an hour, or until the onions are tender. Drain off the water, stir in a large tablespoon of butter and fry a light brown. Season with pepper and salt and serve.

Baked Onions.

Peel and parboil 12 medium onions drain, chop. Melt 2/tablespoons butter substitute, add 2 tablespoons of corn flour, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 11/4 cups cream or soup stock, 4 tablespoons soft bread crumbs, 1 tablespoon fine chopped parsley. Boil five minutes, add 1 egg well beaten and the chopped onion. Cool slightly, add the beaten whites of 2 eggs, add more seasoning if needed and bake in buttered ramekin dishes 20 minutes in moderate oven. Serve soon.

Curried Onions.

Fry to a golden brown, season with alt and pepper, add a teaspoonful of curry powder; add two beaten eggs and lastly a few drops of lemon juice. When the eggs are cooked the dish s ready to serve.

Another way: Boil large onions until tender. Cover the bottom of a baking dish with buttered bread crumbs. Lay he onions in and cover with a thick white sauce. Sprinkle the top with crumbs and bake until a delicate rown

No Fear of "Botulism." "Botulism" has an unpleasant ring in the ears. In plain English it means poisoning from the eating of canned

poisoning from the eating of canned vegetables or fruits. There is no reason why there should be one case of botulism in Canada this year, provided the war garden produce is properly handled. No bac-terial life exists, or can exist, in suc-cessfully canned products. Bacillus botulinus will never be found in pro-perly canned goods. Cooking canned vegetables for ten
