CANADIAN VETS. ALREADY ORGANIZED

Body to Protect Men Maimed
and Disabled in the Big
Conflict Has a Large
Membership.

(Chicago Daily News.)

Ottawa, May 6.—Canada is the graduate year of the war. The United States is the freshman. It is not often that the northern people can play senior to their neighbor's junior. It can be done now. For instance, Canadian wounded and maimed men have been coming back for two years. The military hospitals commission spent nearly \$10,000,000 last year in Canada. That was on men who were fit to come home, many of whom have been more than a year in hospital "over there." Capt. Power, a member of parliament, who still has shrapnel dotted over his body and whose right elbow joint has been removed, was more than a year at Woolwich, and his treatment does not figure in the accounts of the military hospitals commission.

In proportion to population, the United States will be where Canada is when 350,000 returned men have been handled on American soil, and \$150,000,000 has been spent on their restoration to civil life or their discharge from the army. The returned soldier is a great problem of state, already, and a new department of government has been established with a member of the cabinet at its head, to rehabilitate the military citizen into the status of a mere citizen.

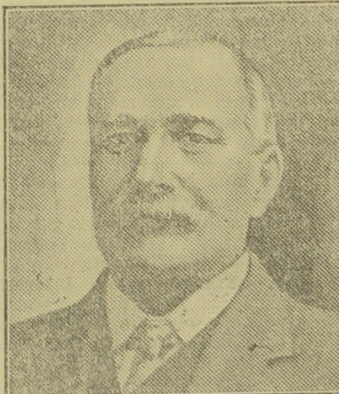
