TO REDUCE COAL BILL.

It is just as extravagant to put coal on the fire from the hod, instead of using a shovel, as it is to our sugar into a cup of coffee without using the sugar spoon, says a writer for a woman's page.

Both are to be condemned. Let me tell you my way.

First thing in the morning open every window and door for about ten minutes. Fresh air heats quicker. In starting the kitchen fire use only four small fire-shovels of coal. Shut all the drafts after the coal is well started. It has been said many times that 95 per cent. of heat goes up the chimney instead of heating the house. Put on only a layer coal at a time.

Result: Full benefit of fire when it is wanted in the house, the kitchen warm and in half an hour coffee is made, eggs boiled and toast a golden brown.

Some put on a whole hod of coal at the starting of the fire, then drafts must be left open for gas to escape, then more coal; result, coal gone and house still cold.

FRAYED EDGES OF CUFFS.

Cuffs that are worn on the edge can be easily mended by wetting the cuff. Wring as dry as possible; smooth the cuff out with the hands. With scissors point start the stitching. You will be surprised how easily the cuff will rip open.

Smooth out the edges and then turn in the ragged edges on both sides of cuff, making new edges, baste together and stitch on the machine while cuff is still damp.

Be careful to put a piece of paper between the feed plate and the damp cuff, thus protecting the machine. Rip

FATALITY AT
JOCKEY RACES

(Canadian Press direct wire.)

London, Feb. 27. — In the collapse of the Chinese public stands at the Hong Kong jockey club races on Tuesday one hundred women and children were trampled to death, according to a Reuter despatch from Hong Kong. Fire broke out and several hundred others were burned to death.

The late Lady Mabella Knox was one of nine brothers and sisters whose aggregate ages totalled 769 years. Five of them lived to the ages of 99, 98, 93, 93 and 89 years respectively.

CITY ELECTION

The Election for Mayor and for Aldermen for the City of Fredericton for the ensuing year will be held on
Monday, the 11th Day of March, 1918,

At the Polling Places as follows:
Division No. 1—For all voters residing or owning property above the northwest centre line of Carleton street prolonged, at or near the City Hall, in the said city.

Division No. 2—For all voters residing or owning property in the remainder of the said City, at or near the County Court House in the said City.

Nominations.

Every Candidate for the office of Mayor or Alderman shall be qualified to vote at the election for which he is nominated, and shall be nominated in writing by at least TWO ratepayers residing in the City of Fredericton, and qualified to vote at the ensuing election for which such Candidate is nominated.

Every nomination paper with the certificate of the City Treasurer shall be filed with the City Clerk or at his office and not later than Four o'clock on the afternoon of MONDAY, the 4th day of March, 1918, and the City Clerk before receiving such nomination paper shall ascertain from the same that the requirements of the Election Act have been complied with.

No Candidate is qualified to be nominated for Alderman unless at the time of nomination he is a resident of the Ward for which he is nominated.

The acceptance of each candidate and the signatures of at least TWO resident qualified voters, who must sign the nomination paper, shall be proved by a witness by affidavit attached to the nomination.

In case of a contest, each elector shall be entitled to vote for ONE candidate for Mayor, for ONE candidate for Alderman for Wellington Ward, for ONE candidate for Alderman for St. Ann's Ward, for ONE candidate for Alderman for Carleton Ward, for ONE candidate for Alderman for Queen's Ward, and for ONE candidate for Alderman for Kings Ward.
