USE POTATOES EVERY DAY.

Potato Peanut Loaf.

1 pint of mashed potatoes, 1 cup of
ground peanuts or half cup peanut
butter, 2 teaspoons salt, half teaspoon
pepper, half cup milk, 2 tablespoons
fat, 2 eggs. Beat the entire mixture
together and place in greased baking
dish; set in a second pan containing
hot water, and bake in the oven until
firm. Serve with tomato sauce.

White Potato Custard Pie.

Two cups rice baked potato, four
eggs, beaten slightly, one cup sugar,
one-fourth cup fat, one-fourth cup thin
cream or top milk, juice and rind of
one lemon. Mix in the order given.
Beat hard for five minutes. Pour into
pans lined with oatmeal pastry crust.
Bake in hot oven twenty to thirty min-
utes or until custard is set. This
makes two pies. Cooked in the form
of patties, this will make eight.

Potato Pudding.

One and a quarter cups mashed po-
tatoes, 4 tablespoons fat, two eggs,
well beaten, half cup milk, quarter
teaspoon salt, half a lemon (juice and
rind), 1 tablespoon sugar, half cup of
raisins and nut meats.

Add to the mashed potatoes the fat,
eggs, milk, lemon juice, grated peel
and sugar. Beat all ingredients to-
gether and bake in greased dish three-
quarters of an hour or longer. Serve
with top milk.

Potato Puffs.

Three cups mashed potatoes, 2 eggs,
1 cup grated cheese, half cup milk, 1
teaspoon salt.

Add the milk to the potato and beat
until thoroughly blended. Add the
beaten egg and salt, gradually adding
the grated cheese. Bake in greased
tins or ramekins in a slow oven.

Quebec, May 18. — A. Leadbeater,
from Kingston, Ont., where he has a
wife and family, and who was employ-
ed as a chemist for the Wyagmack
Pulp Company at Three Rivers, has
disappeared after a period of sickness
and the company offers a reward of
\$300 for any trace of the missing man.
He is believed to have drowned.

YOUNG WOMEN SENTENCED

Geneva, May 18. — Six young wo-
men were among the German inde-
pendent socialists condemned to long
prison terms by the military tribunal
at Dresden recently on charges of con-
ducting "defeatist" and pacifist pro-
paganda among German soldiers, ac-
cording to despatches received here
from Constance. Three of the remain-
ing six socialists sentenced were
youths.

The Constance advices state that
the prison terms imposed ranged from
eight years to eighteen years.

Remove all bones, etc., from one lb.
of boiled salmon (or 1 can); soak 3
slices of bread in milk and chop fine
with the salmon. To this add 1 egg
beaten lightly, 2 tablespoons of but-
ter (melted); put in greased bread
pan and cover with milk. Bake in a
hot oven for 30 minutes. Serve with
a border of green peas.
