

100 PER CENT. UTILITY FOOD.

The housewife practicing food conservation often inquires these days, "What can I throw away?"

"She can properly throw away eggshells, tea leaves, coffee grounds, potato skins; but not one morsel that is fit for human food," states the food administration.

Take bread, for example. "Crush or break up your left-over bread, either allow it to dry or brown it in the oven and then eat it with sugar and cream as a cereal. Bread crumbs may be advantageously used as thickening for soup in place of flour; as a substitute for crackers or to make croutons for soups; for stuffing meat and fowl; in making bread omelets and puddings; and as a substitute for flour in any sort of cake, cookies and puddings.

Don't Throw Away Fat.

It has been estimated that 500,000 tons of fat are thrown away yearly in this country. That amount, if saved, would increase the amount of glycerine used in the manufacture of explosives, by 45,000 tons. It would go far also toward making up the shortage of fats in the food supplies of our Allies.

Don't deliberately go out and buy a soup bone or a can of soup when you might use a bone with a little meat clinging to it, or water in which rice or other vegetables have been boiled, as a basis for the same purpose.

Save food in the little ways. Make food conservation your own problem; apply your own skill to its solution; then teach your neighbor.

CITY ELECTION

The Election for Mayor and for Aldermen for the City of Fredericton for the ensuing year will be held on

Monday, the 11th Day of
March, 1918,

At the Polling Places as follows:
Division No. 1—For all voters residing or owning property above the northwest centre line of Carleton street prolonged, at or near the City Hall, in the said city.

Division No. 2—For all voters residing or owning property in the remainder of the said City, at or near the County Court House in the said City.

Nominations.

Every Candidate for the office of Mayor or Alderman shall be qualified to vote at the election for which he is nominated, and shall be nominated in writing by at least TWO ratepayers residing in the City of Fredericton, and qualified to vote at the ensuing election for which such Candidate is nominated.

Every nomination paper with the certificate of the City Treasurer shall be filed with the City Clerk or at his office and not later than Four o'clock on the afternoon of MONDAY, the 4th day of March, 1918, and the City Clerk before receiving such nomination paper shall ascertain from the same that the requirements of the Election Act have been complied with.

No Candidate is qualified to be nominated for Alderman unless at the time of nomination he is a resident of the Ward for which he is nominated.

The acceptance of each candidate and the signatures of at least TWO resident qualified voters, who must sign the nomination paper, shall be proved by a witness by affidavit attached to the nomination.

In case of a contest, each elector shall be entitled to vote for ONE candidate for Mayor, for ONE candidate for Alderman for Wellington Ward, for ONE candidate for Alderman for St. Ann's Ward, for ONE candidate for Alderman for Carleton Ward, for ONE candidate for Alderman for Queen's Ward, and for ONE candidate for Alderman for Kings Ward.

Recipe for Golden Corn Cakes.

One cup cornmeal, one cup boiling milk, half teaspoonful salt, one tablespoon drippings, one tablespoon molasses, one teaspoon baking powder, two eggs.

Put cornmeal in bowl, cover with boiling milk. Add the salt, fat and molasses, and when cold the baking powder and eggs which have been beaten until light. Mix all well together and bake on a hot griddle.

prising three cotton shirts, two pairs of flannellette undergarments, two or three pairs of woollen socks, three blankets, one sweater, one scarf and a pair of woollen gloves, and in the Vosges mountains and other sectors where the cold is most severe, still more warmer clothing is placed at the disposal of the troops in case of need.

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

Notice is hereby given, that application will be made at the next session of the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick for the passage of an Act to incorporate the New Brunswick Western Railway Company, with a capital stock of \$400,000.00, with power to build and operate a line of railway from a point on the River Saint John in the County of York between Meductic and Pokigok and a point in the Parish of North Lake in the said County at or near the head of North Lake, being on the international boundary between the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada, and there to connect with the Eastern Maine Railroad chartered by the Legislature of the State of Maine, with all the usual powers incidental thereto, and with authority to acquire by purchase or otherwise, and own, operate and sell hydro-electric power and energy for all purposes.
