**FEDERAL
 CONTROL OF
 RAILWAYS**

Washington, Feb. 22.—Champions of
 Government ownership lost by an
 overwhelming vote in the senate to-
 day their fight for indefinite federal
 control of the railroads after the war.
 An amendment to the administration
 railroad bill, offered by Senator John-
 son, of South Dakota, and providing
 that government control should con-
 tinue until congress otherwise ordered
 was defeated by 61 to 10.

**AIRCRAFT ON
 ITALIAN FRONT**

(Canadian Press direct wire.)

Rome, Feb. 21. — The official re-
 port from general headquarters to-
 day reads:

"There was moderate fighting activi-
 ty with frequent artillery actions in
 the Gudarica Valley and west of
 Brenta Valley. North of Valstagna
 our patrols made a few prisoners and
 east of Cape Sile an enemy advanced
 post was destroyed by the explosion
 of a mine.

"The Italian and British airplanes
 attacked efficaciously the enemy's avia-
 tion camps near La Comina, Aviano,
 Visnadello and Motta Di Livensea.
 Over the last place one naval hydro-
 plane dropped two tons of high explo-
 sive bombs. All returned undamag-
 ed.

"Last night eight enemy airplanes
 flew over cities behind our line, caus-
 ing considerable damage. Padova
 was bombarded three times. Numer-
 ous bombs were dropped over Vi-
 cenza, Mestre, Venezia and Trebaz-
 leghe, northwest of Mestre. Fortu-
 nately we have to deplore only a few
 victims among civilians, most of them
 being women. Anti-aircraft batteries
 met the enemy with intense fire. One
 machine struck came down in flames
 near Volpago.

**END OF SPITBALL
 COMING SOON**

New York, Feb. 22.—The end of the
 spitball is coming, John K. Tener, pre-
 sident of the National League, yester-
 day issued a warning to young pitchers
 advising them not to cultivate the use
 of the spit ball, and indicating that it
 was only the matter of a short time
 when it would be abolished.
