HELPFUL HINTS FOR HARD TIMES.

A nice way to repair a pair of cotton blankets (the double ones) when the centre becomes worn is to buy two yards of plain outing flannel to match the blanket and cut next the stripe and set the outing in with a flat seam. The blankets will wear nearly as long as new ones and do not show the mend.

To mend children's stockings take the stocking leg off the foot and lay it flat on a lady's stocking. Cut about a half inch larger than the child's stocking putting the top of each stocking together. Begin at the toe and by being careful you can make several pairs in a few minutes, stitching them on the sewing machine.

A good use for old table cloths is to cut into pieces in a manner to leave out the worn parts, and hemstitch. These make very good tray cloths.

Cold rain water will remove machine grease from washable fabrics if first you rub the spots with laundry soap.

To keep milk from scorching rinse the pan in cold water before pouring in the milk.

Clean the keys of a piano with a cloth moistened with either alcohol or milk.

To preserve cheese, wrap in cloth wrung out in vinegar.

BEEFSTEAK PIE.

Cut the remnants of a steak or roast beef into inch cubes, cover with boiling water, add an onion, simmer until meat is tender. Thicken gravy with flour mixed with water. Season with pepper and salt. Add slices of left-over potatoes. Put into pudding dish, cover with baking powder biscuit mixture and make several incisions in this to allow steam to escape. Bake in a hot oven.
