

seed branch of the Dominion Depart ment of Agriculture, with an assur ance that the supply would be availa ble at the very lowest possible cost f. o. b. at the Quebec elevators. The serious shortage made it impossible for the Dominion department to fulfill their contract and no definite information was forthcoming up to February 15. The department, in order to protect the farmers, again consult ed the dealers and purchased the oats mentioned at \$1.37 per bushel in bags laid down in car lots. Some were pur chased in Prince Edward Island for \$1.25 per bushel in bulk f. o. b. island points. Nova Scotia firms were offer ing \$1.30 to \$1.40 at the same time for the same quality. Seed oats of the same quality cost \$1.38 per bushel laid down to dealers and are now for sale at \$1.75 per bushel. Some deal ers purchased seed oats and had to




