seed branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture, with an assurance that the supply would be available at the very lowest possible cost f. o. b. at the Quebec elevators. The serious shortage made it impossible for the Dominion department to fulfill their contract and no definite information was forthcoming up to February 15. The department, in order to protect the farmers, again consulted the dealers and purchased the oats mentioned at \$1.37 per bushel in bags laid down in car lots. Some were purchased in Prince Edward Island for \$1.25 per bushel in bulk f. o. b. island points. Nova Scotia firms were offering \$1.30 to \$1.40 at the same time for the same quality. Seed oats of the same quality cost \$1.38 per bushel laid down to dealers and are now for sale at \$1.75 per bushel. Some dealers purchased seed oats and had to

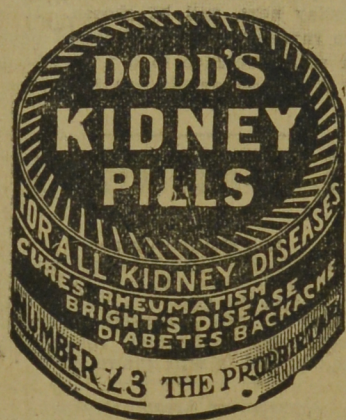

cancel their orders because of freight congestion.

"Feed oats are now selling for \$1.50 per bushel in some sections of this province. It is true that fed oats were purchased at a lower cost earlier in the season, but are rapidly advancing price.

"All correspondence is upon the files of the department and is open for inspection by the leader of the opposition or any of his followers if they wish to peruse it. The entire transaction is open and above board and beyond the pale of unfair criticism. The greater production committee of the province, knowing that fertilizers were going to be scarce, called for prices for fertilizers, carefully considered them, and the lowest price consistent with quality was accepted.

"The minister of agriculture entered into an agreement for 1,500 tons of 3-6-5 fertilizer in order that this material would be available when required in New Brunswick. Information had been received that, unless the department took steps, only a small proportion of the 1,500 tons would come to this province, but instead, would find its way into the large potato growing sections of the United States.



"These goods cost the department \$65 per ton in bags laid down at New Brunswick points in car lots, and were offered to the farmers at \$65.50 per ton cash. The department of agriculture has not handled one dollar of this money, as every shipment was made direct from the factory to the purchaser, with sight draft attached to bill of lading; and all drafts have been honored.

### A False Statement.

"The falsity of the statement is again shown where it is stated there was no analysis of the chemical contents of the fertilizer. The answer to inquiry states there was an analysis and as a matter of fact the percentage was found greater in every ingredient by an analyst of the highest standard in Canada than was called for in the guarantee.

"In Ontario fertilizers of the same analysis are today being sold by the same company for between \$75 and \$80 per ton.

"The entire transaction has been carried on through the banks. The farmers received the fertilizer for actual cost from the manufacturer. Not one cent has been received by the department. The fifty cents per ton will be to pay incidental bank charges.

"The farmers of New Brunswick regardless of their political affiliation, will place as little credence in the opposition organ's attack upon the department of agriculture as they do in the captions under which it has attempted to whitewash the Valley Railway deal.

"The seed and fertilizer transactions of the present administration are open and above board and do not bear the earmarks that characterized the purchase of wheat and 'patriotic' potatoes by the late department.

"The department is anxious and willing that these transactions, which were honestly made for greater pro-
