OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

PROVIDE FOR EMERGENCIES.

It is always well to be prepared for blisters, burns or scalds when there are small fingers and matches, for these have a fatal attraction for each other. Hot stoves and tea kettles do mischief too and the best course of action when these inevitable accidents occur is to apply carron oil immediately. This preparation consists of linseed oil and lime-water in equal parts, and a bottle of it should always be on hand. It must be shaken well before using, and it is well to have a piece of oiled silk to tie over the gauze bandage, for the oil is very greasy and penetrating and will ooze through without this precaution. Never bandage a burn tightly, and do not wash it before bandaging, for the flame or hot fluid has cleansed as it burned.

If a child's clothes catch fire, turn the child upside down at once. Flames tend to rise and the face, head and chest will thus be protected. Wrap rugs, coats, woollen garments—anything thick and heavy—quickly round the child and hug out the flames.

When the blaze is extinguished the clothing should be cut away very carefully and the burned surface treated with applications of oil.

cold water, will take out all traces of iodine stains and will not injure the fabric or color.

When dusting doughnuts with sugar place doughnuts in a paper bag, close top with hand and shake well. The result will be perfect and very little sugar will be used. The doughnuts will be covered evenly, a dozen at a time.

When baking beans, put a pinch of ginger in them and they will be much more easily digested. The ginger will never be detected.

Use denatured alcohol on a soft rag for polishing mirrors or pictures. It makes the process much shorter than when soap and water are used.

NO TRICK TO LIFT A CORN RIGHT OUT

Says there is no excuse for cutting corns and inviting lockjaw.
