POLITICS IN
SIBERIA IN
A TURMOIL

Harbin, Sunday, April 21.—The political situation in Siberia has been complicated during the past few weeks by reverses of the Allies and by rival Russian factions, each to the exclusion of the others. The departure for Pekin of Lieut. General Porvath, the military commander here, has caused alarm in Siberian government representative and socialist groups, who fear that they intend to ask for Allied assistance in support of a dictatorship.

Want Allied Assistance.

At least two factions have asked Allied representatives to notify their governments that the establishment of a dictatorship will be deeply resented in Siberia. The apparent reluctance of the Allied governments to interfere against the Bolsheviks has caused several factions to feel that the only hope of securing Allied support lies in their coalition into a single political organization without party lines and devoted to restoring order in Siberia under a republican form of government, and reestablishing Russia in the war, or at least overthrowing German influence in Siberia.

A former member of the Russian Duma has gone to Tokio to appeal for Allied action, and another delegate has started for Pekin to thwart the efforts of the orvath faction in the direction of a dictatorship, and at the same time to pledge the support of the Siberian government to Gen. Porvath, provided popular guarantee be granted.

Bolshevik Atrocities.

The Bolshevik atrocities at Blagoviestchen have aroused indignation, and the far eastern committee for the defence of the country organization of the National Constituent Assembly, has approached the consular body with a suggestion that the Allied consuls appoint delegates to co-operate in ex-
