ONE WEEK'S BUDGET FOR A FAMILY OF FIVE

1. 40 lbs. potatoes, 14 lbs. other fresh vegetables. Use vegetables freely.
 2. 10 lbs. flour (use as little wheat flour as possible), 10 lbs. cereal in other forms (substitute other cereals for wheat).
 3. 14 lbs. fruit, according to season.
 4. 2 lbs. butter or fat.
 5. 1 lb. cooking fat or oleomargarine.
 6. 7 quarts milk, 3 lbs. sugar, 1 lb. corn syrup, molasses or honey.
 7. Meat and meat substitutes, at least 2 lbs. fresh fish and 1 lb. salt fish, 1 doz. eggs, 2 lbs. dried beans or split peas, 1 lb. cheese. Not over 4 lbs. of lean meat.
- Wheat, meats and fats are needed overseas. Save them in every possible way.

WIN THE WAR RECIPES.

Rice Soup.

- ½ cup of cooked rice,
2 cups rice water
2 cups milk
Onion, celery salt,
2½ tablespoons butter
1½ tablespoons flour
1 teaspoon salt, pepper,
Cayenne, chopped parsley

Press rice and rice water (water rice has been cooked in) through a strainer; heat milk and onion together, strain into rice mixture, melt butter, add dry ingredients, then liquids. Boil 5 minutes.

Boston Cookies.

- Yield about 8 doz., cost about 51c.
1 scant cup butter or substitute,
1½ cups sugar,
3 eggs, well beaten,
1 teaspoon soda, dissolved in 2 tablespoons hot water,
1½ cups fine oatmeal,
1¼ cups graham flour,
1 cup chopped raisins and currants mixed.

Half cup of chopped nuts, any kind,
1 teaspoon cinnamon,
A few drops bitter almond flavoring.
Cream butter and sugar, add rest of ingredients in order given, drop by small spoonfuls on greased pan and bake until brown.

NOTICE

NOTICE is hereby given to all residents, non-residents and corporations, whether within or without the Province, in compliance with "An Act respecting the taxation of Wild Lands" passed 11th April, 1918, to file with the Minister of Lands and Mines at the Crown Land Office in Fredericton, on or before the first of July, 1918, a statement of the number of acres subject to the tax as provided by the Act; parishes where the land is situated; what fractional part of the interest in said lands is held by resident and by non-resident owners, or if owned by a corporation, what fractional part of the stock is held by resident and by non-resident stockholders and the name and address of the manager, managing owner or managing director of said land.

Upon failure to comply with this demand an additional tax of one cent per acre may be imposed, not exceeding in the whole the sum of \$30 in addition to the tax as prescribed by the Act.

Taxes are payable at the Crown Land Office in Fredericton on or before the first of September, 1918, and remittances can be forwarded in the name of T. G. Loggie, Deputy Minister of Lands and Mines.
