## GOVERNMENT GOT MOST OF MILITARY VOTES

SOME CHANGES LIKELY  
 IN N. S. CONSTITUENCIES

In Quebec a Large Majority of  
 Soldier Votes Went to Lib-  
 erals—In the West to  
 the Government.

Ottawa, Feb. 22. — Further returns  
 of the soldiers' vote in Canada show  
 that Quebec is the only province  
 where an opposition candidate received  
 more votes from the men in khaki  
 than did the government candidate.  
 Sir Wilfrid Laurier in Quebec East  
 got 73 votes while Drouin, the govern-  
 ment candidate only received 42. In  
 Quebec West, Parent, opposition, got  
 120 votes to 31 for Chasse, govern-  
 ment. Alphonse Verville got 76 votes  
 from soldiers in St. Denis while Houle  
 his opponent got only two. In Matane  
 of the soldiers' vote polled, Pelletier,  
 the endorsed Laurier candidate got  
 them all and Boulay, the Nationalist-  
 Conservative member in the last  
 house got none. Jacobs, the Laurier  
 candidate in Cartier was given 48 sol-  
 diers' votes while his two opponents  
 got two each.

In Dorchester Hon. Albert Seigney  
 received five votes as against two for  
 his successful opponent, Lucien Can-  
 non.

Down in Nova Scotia Duff, the op-  
 position candidate in Lunenburg who  
 had a majority of over 800 has only  
 had it cut down by a little over 100.  
 In Inverness, where Dr. Chisholm had  
 a majority of nearly 1,600 the Union-  
 ist candidate only received 48 as  
 against 19 for Chisholm. In Digby  
 and Annapolis Davidson, Unionist, se-  
 cured 109 and Lovett 45.

In Westmorland, New Brunswick  
 Copp, opposition, has still over 1,000  
 of a majority. Price securing 86 and  
 Copp 37. Robidoux, the Unionist can-  
 didate in Kent didn't better his case  
 to any appreciable extent only secur-  
 ing 30 votes as against Leger 16. In  
 Restigouche, Michaud, opposition, is  
 still safe, Stewart only pulling down  
 his large majority by 60.

The ballots in the western constitu-  
 encies so far counted show that the  
 western soldiers voted almost solidly  
 for the Union government. In Pro-  
 vencher, the only Manitoba seat won  
 by the endorsed Laurier candidate,  
 Dr. Molloy, he got only five votes to

31 for his opponent, Dr. Johns. In  
 Winnipeg Centre Major Andrews got  
 1,085 soldiers' votes and Ward only  
 46. In Winnipeg North Blake got 342  
 and Rigg, Labor, only 27.

Hon. Arthur Meighen received 64  
 votes in Portage La Prairie and Shirl-  
 iff got two. Hon. T. A. Crerar re-  
 ceived 618 votes in Marquette to seven for  
 Hamilton, opposition.

The only seat in British Columbia  
 which gave an opposition majority  
 was Skeena. The soldiers' vote count  
 gives Peck, Unionist, 95, and Stork,  
 opposition, 15. Stork's majority is  
 still about 450.

In St. John the Unionist majority  
 was increased by 500 as a result of  
 the military vote.

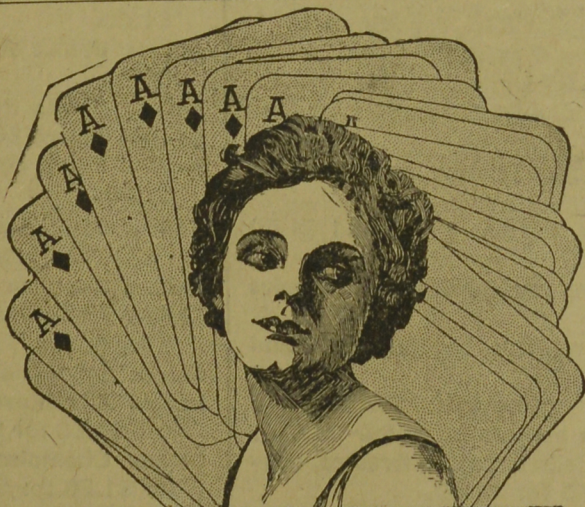
