

## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

FOR WHEATLESS DAY.

Oatmeal Mush with Apples.

Core apples, leaving large cavities. Peel and cook until soft in syrup made by boiling sugar and water together. Allow 1 cupful sugar to 1 3-6 cupfuls water. Fill cavities with oatmeal mush. Serve at once with sugar and cream. Save syrup that is left for future use. Berries, sliced bananas or sliced peaches may be served with the mush instead of apples.

Fried Hominy Slices.

Cut cold cooked hominy in slices and fry in butter until a delicate brown. Serve at once. This may be served with or without a syrup according to one's liking.

Corn au Gratin.

Place in a buttered dish alternate layers of corn and bread crumbs, adding butter, salt and pepper with each layer. Have top layer slightly mixed with cheese. Pour on enough milk between each layer to moisten crumbs. Cover dish and bake in hot oven 20 minutes or until top is brown and puffy. Serve at once.

EGGLESS TAPIOCA PUDDING.

Soak half a cupful of pearl tapioca in cold water for two hours. Scald four cupfuls of milk and pour over half a cupful of yellow cornmeal and add two-thirds of a cupful of molasses or corn syrup, 1½ teaspoonfuls salt, and 3 tablespoonfuls of vegetable fat. Put the mixture in a double boiler for 20 minutes and then stir in the soaked tapioca from which the water has been drained.

Turn the mixture into a greased baking dish and pour over it 1 cupful of skim milk without stirring. Bake an hour and a quarter in a moderate oven and serve with canned fruit juice.

## U. S. UNITS IN THE FRONT LINE

With the American Army in France, Feb. 22. — In a patrol fight, Americans from units under instruction in the famous Chemin Des Dames sector, killed one German and captured another. One American was slightly wounded.

This is the first time it has been permitted to reveal the fact that new American units have entered the line. The troops have been there for some time, suffering slight inconvenience, but their presence was kept secret until it was certain the enemy knew they were there.

## MEXICANS ARE GETTING WHEAT

Buenos Aires, Feb. 21. — The Argentine foreign office says positively that the government will not interfere in the cereal operations of Mexican delegates here, saying that as the embargo has been lifted anyone can buy and ship wheat if he has shipping facilities. It is believed in government circles that the Mexican delegates intend buying much more than the forty thousand tons, the amount they were reported to have bought, but without the assistance of their government.
