St. John Globe: Comparatively good gaspereaux fishing in we'rs is reported for the past two days, and it is expected that as soon as the run of ice in the harbor ceases seiners will take good catches. On Monday the Rapids we'r caught 14,000 fish, and Tuesday night the Belyea we'r No. 2, garnered 16,000. Gaspereaux are wholesaling at \$2.75 per hundred, which is regarded at a good price at this time of year. (The gaspereaux run in the St. John river and tributaries in this vicinity will be on in a few days.)


