London, Aug. 12.—An address President Wilson, intended as a repl to the message sent him by the Dul lin Mansion House's conscription co ferences early in July, has been pre sented to the American embassy.

The address is signed by Sir Edwar Carson, head of the War Aims Com mittee and leader of the Irish Unionis party, the Lord Mayor of Belfast, th president of the Belfast Chamber Commerce and the heads of variou Ulster organizations.

"At a time when all the free dem cracies of the world have accepte the burden of conscription as the onl alternative to the destruction of fre institutions and international justice the address says, "it is easily intelli gible that those who maintain Ire land's right to solitary and privilege exemption from the same obligation should betray their consciousness tha an apology is required to enable then to escape condemnation at the bar ion. 
