OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

WEALTHY PEOPLE ARE SAVING.

(Chicago News.)

Wealthy folk of this city, discussing the food ration plan adopted by New York's rich, declare that the east is far behind the west in the patriotic conservation. New Yorkers agreed to limit themselves to a weekly diet calling for no more than half a pound of butter, two and a half pounds of red meat and of this only half a pound of pork or pork products, half a pound of cooking and kitchen fats, three lbs. of liberty bread and three-quarters of a pound of sugar for the table, cooking and candy.

Rigorous as is this diet, Chicago women declare they have found the real secret of conservation, aided by the government cook book, and the examples shown them in the food show. Accept With Cheerfulness.

The efforts of Lake Shore Drive householders in effecting conservation were described by Mrs. Frederick D. Countiss.

"We didn't need to ask the food administrator for a plan of conservation, because we have been working for months in trying to perfect our means of saving," she said. "I am glad you asked me about it, because I am as proud as can be of my kitchen. The only wheat bread in my home is for the children. Corn-meal bread made from rice flour and other substitutes for wheat. We have had no bacon for three months and when we have griddle cakes we use buckwheat. I have found that many cakes can be made of rice flour. Fruit cakes, even if more expensive than plain cakes, do not require as great a quantity of flour or fats, and are consequently conservation cakes.

Society Women Who Save.

Other society women who have worked out ways of saving in the same way are Mrs. John J. Higgins, Mrs. Frederick Rawson, and Mrs. J. Ogden Armour. Mrs. John C. Bley, chairman of the foods and markets committee of the Women's City Club, declared that Chicago women can be counted on to do their duty in conserving without the assistance of any formal program from Washington.

The Chicago plan of conservation contains the following set of rules:

"Watch your cook and co-operate with her.

"Observe one wheatless meal each day, and one meatless meal.

"Don't use bacon, the soldiers need it.

"Use rice flour and other substitutes whenever possible.

"Use no lard.

"Avoid sweets; this means but two
