BRITISH PAPERS WANT "BILL" HOHENZOLLERN COMMITTED TO EXILE

Although the ex-Kaiser Has Been Rendered Impotent for Further Evil, He Should not be Allowed to Escape Punishment for His Misdeeds—Peace Council Will Likely Decide Matter.

Amsterdam, Nov. 13.—The former Kaiser is using the name, Count William Hohenzollern. He probably will remain indefinitely.

Demand Kaiser be Punished

London, Nov. 13.—Joint action by the Powers will be necessary to send the former Kaiser to Elba, or St. Helena, or to subject him to criminal prosecution, it was pointed out by British officials today.

No anxiety is felt regarding the possibility of Wilhelm again interfering with world peace. He is regarded as impotent for further evil, in view of the drastic armistice forced by the Allies.

The internal situation in Germany is believed to be rapidly precluding any slight pro-Kaiser sentiment that may linger there. Count William Hohenzollern, as he now calls himself is helpless and hopeless, so far as any Napoleonic "return from Elba" is concerned. The former Kaiser lacks the genius to sway the people that was Bonaparte's basis of power.

British newspapers are clamorous for the seizure of Hohenzollern's person, and his committal to exile.

The Evening Standard hopes that immediate steps will be taken to secure possession of the former Kaiser declaring:

"It is the plain duty of the Allies in their own interest as well as that of humanity and the new Germany," it recalls Napoleon's return from Elba and warns against a repetition.

The Borough Council of Depford, the Westminster Gazette announces has adopted the following resolutions: "The future of civilization requires punishment of German authorities,

from the former Kaiser down, who ordered and permitted specific violations of the law."

A copy of the resolutions was sent to Premier Lloyd George and members of Parliament.

"It is our business to demand that the Dutch surrender the former Kaiser into our keeping," said the Express.

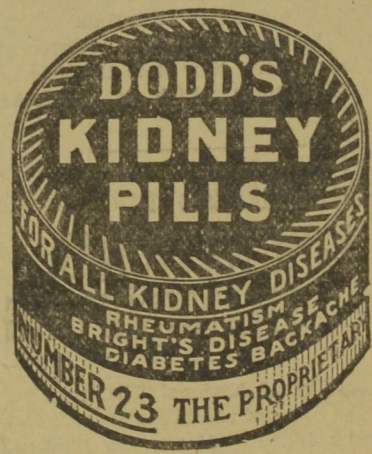
"Wilhelm and his tribe must be brought to judgment or at least held for safe-keeping."

Peace Council Will Decide

The whole question of the former Kaiser's possible extradition will probably be discussed at the peace conference, which is likely to be held in Versailles before the end of the year.

A despatch from Amsterdam today said that Wilhelm arrived on Monday afternoon in Maarsen on a special train to take up his residence at Count von Bentick's castle.

Effective Work Done by Tanks

For these and other reasons the tanks are declared to be by far the best weapon for the break through. But another function they have taken over from the cavalry is that of exploiting a success after the break through has been effected. Cavalry renders its best service in pursuing a disorganized foe. The tanks do not have to wait for disorganization; they cause it and in recent pursuits they have developed such speed as to far outdistance the infantry engaged with them.

Up to this time no adequate defense against the newer tanks has been perfected, according to the writer in the Neue Freie Presse above mentioned. The best way to fight them is with other tanks. Ordinarily they withstand a spraying of machine gun bullets without damage. They are destroyed by artillery fire only by a lucky, direct hit. Mine fields have been laid to stop them, but not enough mines can be planted to destroy any considerable proportion of the large number in use. Naturally rivers, canals and ravines bar their progress, but these obstacles can be overcome with the aid of active engineers.

Thus has a piece of American machinery, intended for farm use, developed into one of the most effective weapons of the world's greatest war.

in Holland cannot be published out of courtesy, the dispatch said, but they are equal to simple military internment. The former Kaiser is not on parole, but is under moral obligation to remain in Holland, and not to do anything contrary to public order, or that would likely to embarrass Holland with her neighbors or the other Powers.

Wilhelm, whom the correspondent say alighting from a special train at Maarsen and entering an automobile was very pale and appeared to be nervous and tired. He was dressed in civilian clothes, as the result of a request by the Dutch military authorities. He was accompanied by his favorite Dachshund.

The Telegraaf of Amsterdam, says that he was allowed to take only his personal property from his train, the non-personal property which was brought to Holland being confiscated as is usual in internment cases. Recent despatches have stated that the former Emperor had taken a carload of archives into Holland.

Holland's hesitancy in dealing with William Hohenzollern is ascribed to the extremely indefinite state of public opinion in Holland by the Amsterdam correspondent of the Mail. He says that German revolutionary soldiers along the Dutch frontier say that they were strictly ordered to prevent the former emperor and his family to escape into Holland.

Late Saturday night and shortly after 6 o'clock on Sunday morning, he says the sound of cannon could be heard from German territory. It was reported that a fight had taken place between revolutionists and royalist troops, and that both sides had used artillery.
