

RECIPES FROM FOOD CONTROL.

Honey Drop Cookies.

Three-fourths cup of honey, one-fourth cup fat, one-half teaspoonful of cinnamon, an eighth teaspoon cloves, one egg, one and one-half to two cups flour, one-fourth teaspoon soda, one teaspoon baking powder, two table-spoons water, one cup raisins cut fine. Warm the honey and fat until the fat melts. While the mixture is warm, add the spices. When cold add the water, the beaten egg and one and a half cups of flour sifted with the baking powder and soda. Finally stir in the raisins. Sufficient flour must be added to make a dough stiff enough to drop from a spoon. Bake in a moderate oven.

Oatmeal Macaroons.

Put one tablespoon of fat into one-half cup of sugar, and mix with one well beaten egg. Stir in one and one-half cups of rolled oats, one-fourth teaspoonful of salt and one half teaspoon of baking powder. Drop in small heaps on a greased pan and bake in a hot oven until crisp.

OH, PRUNES!

Prune Charlotte.

Remove the stones from three cupfuls of stewed and sweetened prunes. Line a buttered pudding dish with slices of well buttered bread. Turn in the prunes and flavor with a teaspoonful of vanilla extract. Cover with slices of buttered bread and bake.

Serve with powdered sugar and cream or with a thin custard.

Prune Pie.

Line a pie tin with a rich pastry crust. Fill with pitted prunes and bake. Cover with a meringue made with the beaten whites of two eggs and two tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar. Brown the meringue in the oven and serve the pie hot or cold.

APPLE DUMPLINGS.

Make a rich biscuit dough and roll very thin, not more than a quarter of an inch in thickness. Place in the centre of each piece an apple pared and cored. Press the dough over the apple and steam for three-quarters of an hour and serve with a hard sauce.
