The Seed is now stored in the elevators at Quebec, thus avoiding transportation difficulties and guaranteeing delivery.

The Department requested the co- operation of the County Councils in the stribution. Seed will be forwarded at their order in car lots, thus avoiding local freights and much handling.

Wheat will cost about \$3.00 per bushel in bags laid down.

The Seed Branch is yet unable to fix the price on oats. Definite prices

will be stated in this space immediately they are at hand. New Brunswick is expected to bread herself for the duration of the war.

the County Councillors immediately.
