### THE KILLING GROUNDS OF FREEDOM

(Chicago News.)

Places with names—that is about all that differentiates Ypres, Baillieu, Givenchy and other war shattered landmarks of the battle area from the surrounding territory. In the minds of those who read about the battles these places with names have a sentimental and, to a degree, a moral value greatly out of proportion to their strategic value. An army might retire ten miles over a region where no "important" towns were held and occasion less alarm among people at home than it causes by retiring a few hundred yards and giving up a place with a name.

As a matter of fact, most of the towns in the war disintegrated area are towns no longer. They are heaps of dismal ruins and may have but two actual strategic values. They may be centres of communication and supply lines or they may have topographical features that lend themselves admirably to purposes of defense. In this war of mighty shifts by mighty organizations no army permits itself to become dependent upon any one centre or system of communication and supply. An alternative or substitute system is always in readiness or can be prepared and utilized on demand. Consequently the real value of a place with a name is exactly that of a place without a name—topographical. It is either good killing ground or it is not.

In the capture of "towns" such as Baillieu, Neuve Eglise, Wulverghem, the Germans have achieved little more than a sentimental advance—and have paid an awful price for that. In Wytschaete and Messines Ridge, however, they have taken what were excellent killing grounds for the British. The latter are reported to be occupying heights beyond these elevations that prevent the Germans from scoring any but a negative advantage from their advance.

These killing grounds, too, may be taken at a price. And beyond them are other killing grounds. As the British back slowly over the battlefields the streams run red to the sea with the best blood of Germany. The Kaiser and his people have paid a price already that they cannot afford to pay, and they must go on paying—without gaining the victory that Hindenburg promised for the million of young men slain.

### NOTICE

NOTICE is hereby given to all residents, non-residents and corporations, whether within or without the Province, in compliance with "An Act respecting the taxation of Wild Lands" passed 11th April, 1918, to file with the Minister of Lands and Mines at the Crown Land Office in Fredericton, on or before the first of July, 1918, a statement of the number of acres subject to the tax as provided by the Act; parishes where the land is situated; what fractional part of the interest in said lands is held by resident and by non-resident owners, or if owned by a corporation, what fractional part of the stock is held by resident and by non-resident stockholders and the name and address of the manager, managing owner or managing director of said land.

Upon failure to comply with this demand an additional tax of one cent per acre may be imposed, not exceeding in the whole the sum of \$30 in addition to the tax as prescribed by the Act.

Taxes are payable at the Crown Land Office in Fredericton on or before the first of September, 1918, and remittances can be forwarded in the name of T. G. Laggie, Deputy Minister of Lands and Mines.
