HON. MR. TWEEDDALE in reply to Mr. Sutton:

1. Q. On whose recommendation was H. B. Durost dismissed from the Department of Agriculture, and for what reason?

A. Mr. H. B. Durost was dismissed from the Department upon information from reliable authority that he was an offensive partisan.

HON. MR. VENIOT in reply to Mr. Dickson:

1. Q. Has any consideration been given by the Government to the rebuilding of the Perry Point Bridge over the Kennebecasis River in Kings county, which was carried away by the freshet in 1909?

A. Not yet.

2. Q. Is it the intention of the Government to replace this bridge? If so, when?

A. The matter will be taken into consideration.

HON. MR. MURRAY in reply to Mr. Sutton:

1. Q. Is Mr. John A. Lindsay registrar of vital statistics for Carleton county? If not, why was he removed from office? When? And for what cause?

A. No. He was removed from the office of divisional registrar of births, marriages and deaths on July 11th, 1917.

2. Q. Was he notified of the intended removal?

A. No.

3. What is the salary of the registrar, and by whom paid?

A. There is no salary but the services of the registrar is paid by the County Council, by fees for each register of a birth, death or marriage. In 1916 there were 71 births, 94 deaths and 220 marriages registered in Carleton county and the fees from the same amounted to \$38.50.

4. Q. If the registrar of vital statistics for Carleton has been removed, upon whose recommendation was it made?

A. The registrar was removed upon the recommendation of those having the patronage of the county, Messrs. Jones, McCain and Upham.

5. Q. Who is the registrar of vital statistics for Carleton county at the present time, and by whom was he recommended for appointment, and when was the appointment made?

A. William H. Everitt, recommended for appointment by Messrs. Jones, McCain and Upham, was appointed July 11th, 1917.

1. Upon whose recommendation was Roy W. Cameron, stipendiary magistrate for the Parish of Brighton, Carleton county, dismissed?

A. Upon the recommendation of those having the patronage of the county—Messrs. Jones, McCain and Upham, on the grounds of partisanship, and upon a letter from Mr. Roy W. Cameron himself admitting the correctness of the charge.

2. Q. Did the Government receive any letters or petitions protesting against this dismissal? If so, who were they from, and what was their nature?

A. From Roy Cameron, Dr. Curtis and M. L. Hayward. The nature of the last two communications was that Mr. Cameron was a good official and on that ground should not be dismissed.

HON. MR. VENIOT in reply to Mr. Smith (Carleton):

1. Q. Did the Minister of Public Works or any member of the Government give a letter to Mr. Harry M. Blair previous to or since his appointment?

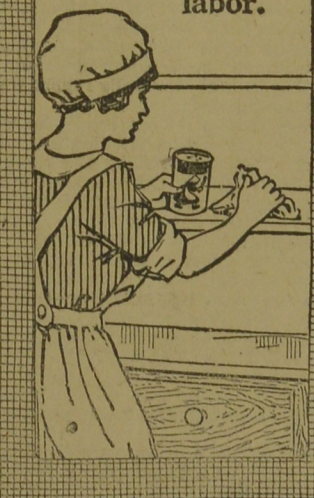

2. Q. If so, what is the nature of this letter, and in what way does it refer to his salary and expenses?

A. The following is a copy of the letter referred to:

July 14th, 1917.

H. M. Blair, Esq.,

Fredericton, N. B.

Dear Sir:—

You are engaged to tour the Province of New Brunswick acting as official to enforce the Automobile Law insofar as the collection of fees are concerned. Make collections and report to the Department. Prosecute where you deem necessary and in the best interests of the Province. You will also report any neglect you may discover on the part of Road Super-

visors as you travel along the roads. Your remuneration will be \$400 per month, you to pay all expenses personal or otherwise, except legal expenses, postage and telephone.

The division of the \$400 per month was afterwards made as follows: \$125 per month salary and \$275 per month expenses and hire of car.

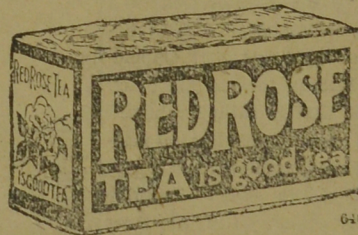
