**Baked Bean Loaf.**  
1 pint cold baked beans.  
1 egg (beaten).  
1 cup bread crumbs.  
Salt and pepper.  
1 tablespoon minced onion.  
2 tablespoons catsup.  
Combine ingredients and shape into a loaf. Bake for 25 minutes. Baste with melted fat and hot water occasionally while cooking.

**Macdonald College.**  
**Graham Bread.**  
 $\frac{3}{4}$  cup of rice flour, or 1 cup white flour.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cups sweet milk.  
2 cups Graham flour.  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar.  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup molasses.

1 heaping teaspoon baking powder or  
1 level teaspoon soda.  
2 level teaspoons cream of tartar.  
1 teaspoon salt.  
Mix dry ingredients together, add liquids and beat thoroughly. Bake 1 hour.

**Use Fruit.**  
Fruit helps to keep the body in good health and to prevent constipation. Use fresh fruit when possible. Use prunes, dried apples, dried apricots. Soak them in water over night and cook them long enough to make them tender. Use dates or raisins. These are good added to the cereal ten minutes before taking from the stove, then you will not need sugar.

**To Furnish Energy.**  
Dates, figs and raisins furnish almost as much energy as there is in sugar candy.
