NOW PUT AWAY YOUR FURS.

Home Devices for Care of Furs in the
Spring and Summer—Newspapers
and Pepper are Useful.

Where the value of the fur will justify the expense, the regular cold storage of the fur dealers will always be the best method of keeping the fur during the summer months. The vitality of the fur is renewed under the freezing temperature. For those who will use their furs during the summer, however, the very simple method of allowing them to hang loose when not in use and of frequently airing it in the hot sunshine will check the ravages of the moth. The following home devices have been successfully used in storing furs:

Black pepper, rubbed into the fur will keep the fur free from moths and has been used in all cases successfully, with the exception of white beaver. After treatment store the furs away in the dark. Tobacco dust may be used in the same manner, especially if the furs are afterward wrapped in newspapers to prevent it from losing its strength. Always use newspapers, as the odor of printer's ink is distasteful to the moths.

An Old Standby.

Cedar is an old standby, and even if you cannot have the use of a cedar chest you can at least invest in enough red cedar shavings for your purpose, or, failing that, take empty cigar boxes and split them up into fine bits.

Before storing the furs, clean them thoroughly. To remove all dust, beat with a length of rubber hose if you have it. Coarse furs, such as bear, buffalo and even fox, may be washed. Use a lukewarm suds of good quality white soap. Wipe the fur with a dry piece of cloth and then hang it where it will dry quickly. Complete the process by combing the fur with a coarse comb.

Furs of lighter quality may be cleaned by rubbing thoroughly into them hot bran or cornmeal. Lay them aside for a few days, and then, taking them out again, brush them thoroughly and they are ready for use.

HOMINY WAR BREAD.

2 cups mashed potatoes, 3 cups ~~can-~~
ed hominy, 1 teaspoon fat, 1 teaspoon
salt, 1 yeast cake, 4 cups water, white
flour to make stiff dough.

Method: Put hominy through meat
grinder. Dissolve yeast cake in luke-
warm water; put water, yeast cake,
hominy, mashed potatoes, salt, melted
fat and 1 quart flour into the bread
mixer. Mix by turning about 3 min-
utes. Add more flour if necessary, to
salt, 1 yeast cake, 4 cups water, white
Mold, put into tins, cover with fat and
allow to double in bulk. Bake as usual.
