## **RULES FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF INFLUENZA AND CARE OF THE SICK**

6. Insist upon the patient using a handkerchief to cover coughing or 3. If the disease appears in the sneezing (paper ones will do); these

7. Do not permit patient to mingle

take particular care to avoid exposure to chills and dampness, as pneumonia is quite frequent under these circum-stances and constitutes the gravest danger connected with the disease. Remain in house three or four days after feeling well, as this is a critical period after recovery.
9. Call a doctor upon the occurrence of suspicious symptoms as unusual backache, headache, 'chills followed by fever, etc., as it is dangerous to depend upon household treatment in this disease.

this disease. 10. Do not be over-anxious. That is do not worry respecting the danges of contracting the disease. Such worry serves no good purpose and sometimes renders one more liable to contract it. Follow the above preventive measures and the advice of the physician. 11. If, in the family affected, there be no suitable provision for proper iso-lation of the patient, it is strongly re-commended that he be removed to some hospital, or other place tempor-arily established, for the proper iso-lation and care of those affected.
