HOUSEHOLD HINTS

A light ceiling makes a room lighter.

White Shoes Here Again

The white shoe so much admired
last summer, is here again in all of its
popularity to be worn indiscriminately
with tailored suits and summer frocks
just as last season. The new canvas
used in these shoes is so finely woven
that it is difficult to tell it from kid
or buckskin at first glance. The white
shoe, after all, is practical. One gives
more care to it for the most part than
to the tan or black for the reason that
its needs are obvious. Of course

Hand Embroidery

Hand embroidery shows no sign of
losing favor. Sometimes it is the regu-
lar needle variety, but more often
there are applied designs in soutache
or chille. A coat costume showing the
latter touch is cut upon perfectly
straight lines, with a deep cape collar
with a simple chenille design about
two inches above the edge; and there
is a corresponding design around the
bottom of the skirt about the same
distance from the hem.

A Novel Knitting Bag

A novel knitting bag is made of a
white Panama hat. The crown of the
hat forms the bottom of the bag and
the brim is folded together to form
the top edge. A strip of silk is ar-
ranged inside of the brim to form the
opening to the bag. This is drawn up
with ribbons. The hat is trimmed with
applied flowers of silk, the color of
the ribbons.

MAINTENANCE OF WAY MEN WANT MORE PAY

(Canadian Press direct wire.)

Toront, May 21—Fifteen thousand
maintenance of way employees of Cana-
dian railway employees will be asked to
vote on the question of pressing
for an eight hour day and a substan-
tial increase and uniform rate of pay
for all maintenance of way men in
Canada. The executives of the Inter-
national Brotherhood of maintenance
of way employees met here today to
discuss the advisability of such a step
and passed a resolution embodying
these demands which will be sub-
mitted to the membership of the Broth-
erhood for ratification and endorsement.
The executives also passed a reso-
lution strongly deprecating the utter-
ance of president Watters, of the Do-
minion Trade and Labor Congress,
attacking the British premier, Lloyd
George. Mr. Watters attack is brand-
ed as "unjustifiable" and the dele-
gates state that they wish to dis-
associate themselves from the senti-
ments he expressed.

AMERICANS LAUNCH LOCAL GAS ATTACK

(Canadian Press direct wire.)

With the American Army in France,
May 21.—The American artillery
northwest of Toul launched a sudden
and terrific local gas attack upon the
German positions and cantonments
within the Gerschamp wood early to-
day. Heavy punishment was inflicted
upon the enemy. The deluge of Am-
erican shells fell in three waves and
within a half hour the woods in which
many Germans were sleeping had been
drenched with a large quantity of poi-
sonous gas. In lively patrol actions
Monday night and this morning east of
Luneville, German parties were easily
defeated by the Americans, who cap-
tured more prisoners.
