MAKE THE MOST OF APPLE

Most people know apples are healthful. But a great many do not know that they are among the most nutritious of fruits and that their value in this way is higher than that of many every day foods commonly regarded as indispensable to our tables. One pound of raw apples has the food fuel value of 290 calories. Translated into everyday terms this means that apples have about three-fourths the nutritive value of potatoes, and, as every one knows, potatoes are a solid

The windfall apples should be saved by drying. Cut out the bruised parts, pare, core and slice. Then drop into cold water containing eight teaspoonfuls of salt to the gallon, if a light colored product is desired. Leaving them a mightle or two in salt water.

Make Mint Jelly.

The best mint jelly is made with the julce of slightly unripe apples as a basis. Wash fresh mint leaves thoroughly. To one cunful of mint leaves. aghly. To one cupful of mint leaves acked solid add one cupful of boiling

to two tablespoonfuls of mint juice. If the mint flavor is not sufficiently pro-nounced add a drop or two of mint extract. Use three-quarters cupful of sugar to each cupful of apple juice, and boil the mixture rapidly until the jelly test is obtained. Just before it is poured into the scalded glasses color it green with vegetable coloring mat-ter

Early apples make the best apple sauce. Here is a new way to sweeten and flavor the apple sauce and add more food value to the dish at the

same time:
One quart of apples.
One cup seeded raisins.
Quarter teaspoon salt.
Wash, quarter and remove stem and blossom end from apples; put on stove with half cup of water. Cover and as soon as the apples get soft start mashing. When tender mash through colander or wire straier return to fire, add salt and raisins which have been washed, dried and put through food chopper. Boil slowly ten minutes.
