GERMAN MARK TAKES A SLUMP

Geneva, June 27.—The German mark is now worth less than the French franc on Swiss exchanges for the first time in fifteen months. On the Geneva bourse Allied exchanges continue to increase, while those of the Central Powers are decreasing, despite efforts by Berlin and Vienna to raise the value of their exchanges. The decreases in exchange on the Central Powers began when news of the Austrian defeat on the Piave reached Switzerland.
