





Mr. Dodge made an address in which he said in part:-

"You and I are either too young or too old to go to the front. We are outside the draft age, but, thank God, we are not outside of the fighting age, either of us.

"Don't worry about silly, thoughtless criticism. Why, the other day a critic said:-'Fighting the yellow dog is a good idea, but it doesn't belong to a boy. It's a man's job."

Boys Doing Men's Jobs

"So it is a man's job, but the boys are doing it. These are war times; all the jobs are men's jobs, and when a boy does one he measures up to the stature of a man. You're living through one of the most awful crises of the world's history. No boy ever had such an experience before. Our ship's in a frightful storm. Every one must lend a hand. I was going to say every man within the ages of eighteen and forty-five, but I'll change it and make it every male and female between the ages of eight and eighty. They've all got to do men's jobs now adays.

"Men must talk. If they can't talk evil they must talk good, even of the government. We must stop their wagging their poor foolish jaws to weaken us. If they wag them at all it must be in favor of Uncle Sam."

In closing Mr. Dodge asked the boys been destroying or mutilating patriotic posters on the fences, especially "Tell That to the Marines."

W. B. Roulstone, of the American Defence Society, made a speech in which 'he assured the boys that the society will back them to the limit in their good work.



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
