Grade VIII and less than two per cent. in Grade XI. Less than eight per cent. are in secondary grades. (See App. B.)

4. Grade IX, 1,103; Grade X, 651; Grade XI, 343. This is the distribution of pupils in the high schools of New Brunswick last year. Those pupils that did not reach secondary grades very largely drop out before graduating. These figures show conclusively that the New Brunswick schools are not training our young in adequate numbers through the secondary period; nor are they carrying a large proportion through the elementary grades. It would seem that the present secondary school training is not acceptable to the great majority of our people.

5. Sixteen thousand of secondary school age not in school. There are at least 20,000 persons in the province of New Brunswick between 14 and 18 years of age, i. e., of secondary school age; 2,068 of these are enrolled in the public high schools; 769 are attending private schools. There are scattered throughout our rural schools but these for the most part are not doing work of secondary grade. There are therefore at least 16,000 young persons in New Brunswick of high school age who are not under any systematic educational influence.

6. The great majority of our young people are destined to enter industry. The school age population may be divided into two groups—those destined to go to college and those who enter industry immediately upon leaving the public school. Of these two groups the latter comprises the great majority of our young people. Our schools are selecting those who can and wish to take a university course. The records show it to be a comparatively small number. Most of our young people are destined to enter industry.

7. No facilities are at present offered by our schools to prepare this great majority for profitable employment. The schools at present aim and prepare students to enter college. The large number of girls and boys indicated are allowed to enter industry without a satisfactory elementary education and entirely destitute of specific training to fit them for profitable employment.

8. Apprenticeship and home instruction in occupations have disappeared. Formerly workers were trained through the activities of the home and by means of apprenticeship agreements. The old home occupations

have now become commercialized, so that boys and girls no longer "learn to do by doing" in their homes. Industry has been to a large extent divided up into highly specialized processes. A worker learns one of these and usually is kept at it so that in industry he gets no chance for thorough training. Vocational education would therefore be greatly appreciated by this large group of young people. New Brunswick has 100,000 workers engaged in industry to say nothing of 75,000 housekeepers, many of whom would appreciate opportunity to increase their earning power and efficiency. Will it pay the province of New Brunswick to train these 16,000 adolescents and this large number of workers for higher efficiency and greater production?

9. The economic value of vocational education. An increase of ten cents per day in earning power would mean \$3,000,000 added income to New Brunswick workers. Ten cents per day is a very moderate increase in earning power. Many workers have

increased their earning power by ten times this amount by a short course of vocational training. Yet if this small increase were made possible to our workers they would be better off by \$10,000 a day and \$3,000,000 a year. Vocational education would soon pay for itself in this field alone.

10. Vocational education saves three or four years of the productive life of the worker. When vocational training is offered a boy he is compelled if he leaves school at 14 to lose three or four years as a producer. He cannot enter industry advantageously until sixteen. The manufacturer has nothing he can do except dead end jobs. At sixteen he really commences to learn a trade. At twenty he is a fairly efficient journeyman earning in normal times \$15 a week. Owing to lack of proper education his chances for promotion are not bright. If at fourteen he had gone to a good vocational school giving half time to practical production on a commercial basis and half time to the technology of his trade, English and civics, he would at seventeen have the same earning power that he otherwise would have at twenty, with an indefinitely better chance for promotion. The advantage of such a start in life can hardly be overestimated.

11. New Brunswick should save this three years of production to 2,000 boys each year. Out of the secondary school age population not in school vocational education should give New Brunswick a class of 2,000 trained well developed workers of seventeen or eighteen years of age each year. Suppose only half of this were accomplished what would be the economic value to the province?

12. 1,000 trained workers graduated each year means \$2,250,000 increase

ed earning power. From the money standpoint alone 1,000 workers graduated from vocational schools would mean a conservation of \$2,250,000 to those so trained. Besides this it would open up to them a road to advancement that would otherwise forever remain barred.
