

SAVE THE WHEAT.

Why?

At best the food of our Allies will be a privation loaf. In order to give them even this, we are asked to save one-fourth of our wheat flour.

We can do this by the use of vegetables. "Eat the vegetables and save the bread," should be one of our kitchen mottoes.

Use other cereals in the making of bread, e.g., cornmeal oatmeal, rye, bran.

Use also quick-breads and pancakes freely, buckwheat being a good substitute.

Let us cut our bread at the table, as it is needed, and avoid left-over slices.

In this column we have already given out several recipes for wheat-saving breads.

Enough cannot be said in favor of oatmeal in breads and cakes.

We all know how easily obtained it is. It will absorb far more water than wheat flour and retain it longer. It is as cheap as any other ingredient available. Last and not least, the oatmeal loaf is said to have a greater nutritive value than even a straight wheat flour gives, and far greater than a cornmeal or barley mixture.

We all know the large amount of oatmeal consumed by our hardy Scottish forefathers, and to this food they owe much of their brain and brawn. Let us follow their example.

Corn, one of our great natural breadstuffs, is not used as much as its nourishing value warrants. The old familiar Johnny-cake we all know well,
