


WARTIME RECIPES

Welcome Hints for the Cook Who is Bothered by Meatless Days.

Kidney Bean Stew

Wash 1 cupful of dried kidney beans and soak them over night. Cook the beans in the water in which they were soaked until they are tender and then add to them 11/2 cupfuls of canned to- had. matoes, 2 tablespoonfuls of uncooked rice 1 small onion, half a teaspoonful each of salt and pepper, two tablespoonfuls of vegetable fat or bacon dripping and 2 tablespoonfuls of flour Cook the rice, beans, tomatoes, onion and seasoning until the rice is soft and then stir in the fat and thicken with the flour mixed with a little cold milk.
Serve with rye toast and cheese.
Potatoes and Corn Croquettes.
This recipe affords an excellent op-

portunity to utilize two vegetable leftovers-cold mashed potatoes and cold canned corn. Mix 1 cupful of mashed potatoes which have been re-heated with 1 cupful of canned corn. Stir in tablespoonful of melted margarine and a half teaspoonful each of salt and pepper. Beat 1 egg and stir into the mixture. Mold into croquettes and din in beaten egg, roll in coarse corn neal and fry in vegetable oil or oleo.

Macaroni with Green Pea Sauce. Four ounces uncooked macaroni, pint boiling water, half a teaspoonfu of salt, 1½ cupfuls green pea sauce Cook macaroni until tender and add the sauce, serving hot with chees croutons and garnish with parsley. Two cupfuls of canned green peas,

Cheese Croutons.




