IRISH ANTI'S
SEND A MESSAGE
TO PRES. WILSON

Dublin, July 3.—The Mansion House anti conscription conference last night issued a message sent to President Wilson through Ambassador Page in London. The document is lengthy and recounts all the well known grievances concerning British misgovernment in Ireland. It asks judgment from the United States at a time when Great Britain, which strove a century and a half ago to crush the American colonies for asserting the people wanted no taxation without the consent of its representatives, now threatens to crush the Irish people unless they consent to a blood tax against the protests of their representatives.

The document emphasizes that up until the year 1900 privilege of free citizens to bear arms in self defence had always been refused to Ireland and continues. During the American revolution the champions of your liberties appealed to the Irish parliament against their aggression today it is our turn to appeal to America. Today as in the days of George Washington, nearly half of the American forces have been furnished from the descendants of our banished race.

"Yet while self determination is refused we are required by law to bleed to 'make the world safe for democracy in every country except our own.' Declaring that the bones of ten thousand children of Ireland lie whitening on the battlefields of the present war the appeal asks what is to be their reward—the spot on earth they loved best and which they hoped their sacrifices might help to freedom lies until redeemed under an age-long thralldom."

The document concludes with an eloquent appeal to the president, whose exhortations have inspired the souls of the nations of the world with fortitude to defend to the last their liberties against our oppressors."

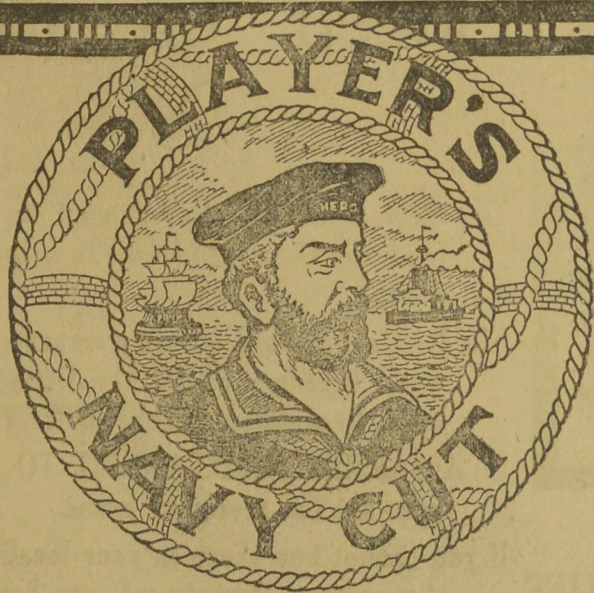
GERMAN DRUGS
CONFISCATED
AT HALIFAX

Halifax, N. S. July 4.—In the admiralty prize court here, Judge Drysdale ordered the confiscation of a quantity of medicine manufactured in Germany which was seized by the naval inspection staff here from the luggage of R. Silva Zamorona, a Chilean diplomat aboard the Dutch steamer Hollandia, which, while on voyage from Amsterdam to Buenos Ayres, called at this port September 1917, for examination. One of the inspectors testified yesterday that he had examined M. Zamorona's luggage and in one of his trunks found packages and bottles of medicine, each bearing labels printed in German. On one of these parcels was written the name of the wife of a German general residing in Berlin. The inspector said that the Chilean diplomat claimed that the trunk was the property of a friend who had preceded him to America. W. A. Henry, K. C. for the Crown, informed the court that the Chilean representative in Canada had been notified of the proceedings. He also said that a registered letter had been sent to M. Zamorona, owner or custodian of the trunk, to the same effect but that there had been no response. Neither the ship nor M. Zamorona were represented in court. Judge Drysdale ordered the medicine, which is believed to have been manufactured at a famous dye works in Germany and which is valued at several thousands of dollars, to be sold by the marshal of the court.
