HINTS FOR THE COOK.

Salt and Sugar in Bread.

Not every bread maker knows that
while salt retards the action of yeast,
sugar on the other hand contributes to
its power. For this reason many per-
sons add the sugar to the "wetting" as
soon as the yeast is added, in order to
aid its activity; but do not add the
salt till later, when they mix it thor-
oughly with the second addition of
flour.

Oat Muffins.

One cup cooked oatmeal, 1½ cup
sifted flour, 4 teaspoons baking pow-
der, 1 egg, half teaspoon salt, 2 tea-
spoons fat. Milk or water to mix a
soft dough about half cup.

A Fruit Dessert.

Two cups diced pineapple, 1½ cups
maraschino cherries, half cup mixed
juice. Mix, chill and serve.

To Make Smooth Gravy.

Put flour in cup or bowl, add water
and salt and beat with the egg beater,
and see how smooth it will come. Add
to juice of cooked meat and stir until
cooked thoroughly.

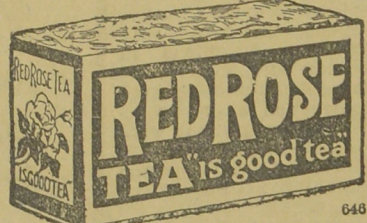
