REPAIRING BLANKETS.

In the days to come we may be glad to conserve the very things that we now lightly discard. For instance, blanket material is being drawn upon in enormous quantities for our soldiers and sailors. Then why should you now cast away a blanket, quilt or comfortable that shows signs of wear?

First wash the article and mend the holes or baste strong pieces over them. Then measure your old cover and buy covering enough for both sides—a bit of gay cretonne will transform the oldest blanket into a bright bedroom ornament.

When you're ready to cover it, lay the article on the bottom cover on the floor, place the upper cover on top, and straighten out all wrinkles. Then with strong cotton, knot through close enough to hold the inside firm, and turn the edges in, stitching all around. Thus you can easily transform an almost "worn out" blanket into a bed covering that will be pretty and will last for years. And not only will you have saved money for yourself, but you will also have saved blanket material for the nation.

SHORT CUT IN IRONING.

After the towels are washed and still in the first rinse water, fold them just as if you were going to put them away. Then put them through the wringer in to the bluing and wring from the bluing still flatly folded. Hang over a clothes horse and let dry.

Don't store onions, squash or pumpkins in a cold cellar. They will keep better in the attic.

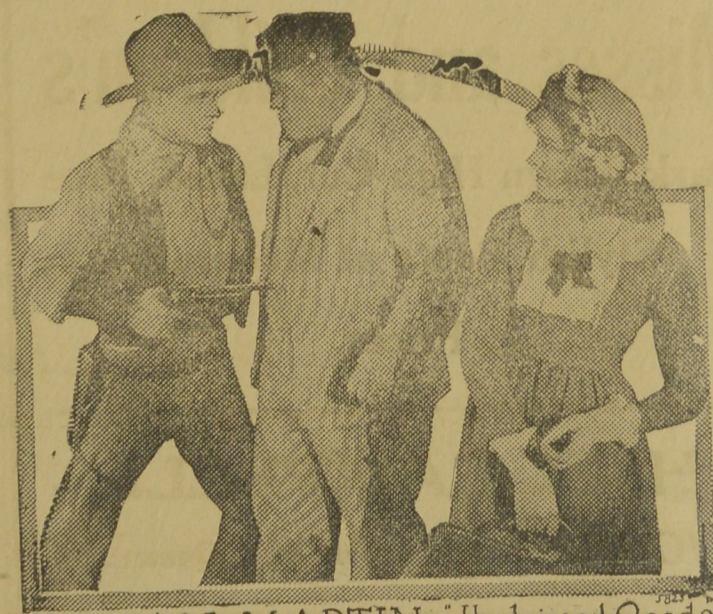
