VEGETABLE PIE.




AT THE GAIETY THEATRE WEDNESDAY and THURSDAY

London, Aug. 18—Universal war bread of better quality than last year for all the nations fighting Germany practically without rationing, will be one of the chief results of the food controllers conferences in London, Robert Schrover, American food administrator announced to the Assd. Press today. He added that there will be ample supplies of fats and meat if the populations are economical and avoid waste.
