

INJURED IN A COLLISION IN BOSTON

**MR. AND MRS. EDW. EDNEY
IN AUTOMOBILE SMASH**

Will Take Legal Action to Recover Damages—Mrs. Edney was Unconscious for Some Time.

Friends in this city have received information from Boston to the effect that Mr. and Mrs. Edward Edney of this city were in an automobile accident last week and both were injured. Mr. Edney went to Boston with the intention of having an operation performed upon one of his feet which was injured in boyhood and which never was properly set. In the collision between the car in which he and his wife were driving and a motor truck his uninjured foot was severely hurt. He also received other injuries and was badly shaken up. Mrs. Edney was badly hurt and was unconscious for some time after the accident. Among her injuries were severe cuts about the shoulders.

To Take Legal Action

It is reported that as the result of the injuries which his wife and himself sustained in the accident Mr. Edney will take legal action against the persons responsible. Mr. and Mrs. Edney were expected to return home in the latter part of this week but it is probable that the accident will delay their journey.

PAYMENT OF TAXES EQUAL TO LAST YEAR'S

**CITY TREASURER'S OFFICE
A BUSY PLACE TODAY**

Discount Period Expires Tomorrow—Prompt Collection will be Made After That.

The office of the City Treasurer was crowded all day today with those desirous of paying their taxes and getting the discount which is allowed on all taxes paid on or before August 21st. There is every indication that the total payment of taxes in the discount period will approximate that of last year when the payment was the largest on record. The fact that the regulation imposing an interest charge of one half per cent per month on all taxes in arrears after the expiration of the discount period was in effect had much to do with making payments prompt last year and the same rule is in effect this year.

To Be Open at Night

The office of the City Treasurer will be open tonight and tomorrow night to accommodate citizens who may wish to pay their taxes. The discount period will expire tomorrow at midnight. Mr. H. C. Rutter formerly collector of taxes is assisting City Treasurer Perkins. It was not possible today to make an estimate of what had been paid in but it is believed that the amount is as large as last year.

To Collect Promptly

It is announced that prompt collection of taxes in arrears will begin immediately after the close of the discount period. Collector Charters who was appointed a few months ago is ready to go on the job and is working under a new system which is expected to produce good results.

Adjusting Insurance Loss

CASUALTIES ARE INCREASING IN NUMBERS

**GR. PERCY VRADENBURGH
REPORTED WOUNDED**

Now in Hospital at Bristol—Coma Jones of Northfield Killed in Action—Others Wounded.

Casualties from this section of the province among the men serving in the Canadian Expeditionary Force are increasing steadily.

Mrs. Leonard Mercer of Northfield Sunbury County, has been notified of the death in action of Coma Jones, serving with the infantry.

Gr. Percy Vradenburgh

Relatives of Gunner Percy Vradenburgh of this city were notified today that he was admitted to hospital in England, August 15th with gunshot wound. The extent of his injury was not mentioned. Gunner Vradenburgh is a son of Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Vradenburgh, Carleton Street, and had been in the C. E. F. some three years. Another brother William also is overseas. Prior to enlisting he was with the Bank of British North America at Weston, Ont., prior to which he had been with that bank in Fredericton and other places in the Maritime Provinces. Miss Frances Vradenburgh of the teaching staff of the St. John public schools is a sister and Mr. John Vradenburgh of St. John is a brother. Miss Josephine Vradenburgh of this city is a sister. Gunner Vradenburgh went overseas with the 41st Field Battery. He is in the 2nd Southern General Hospital, Bristol.

Pte. Ernest Williams of Barker's Point is reported wounded in the right foot.

Among the men reported wounded is J. E. Toban of Newcastle Bridge. Pte. George H. Nason son of Mr. and Mrs. Merritt Nason of Bridge Street, Devon is reported wounded with the infantry. Sergt. Fred M. Staples son of Mr. Oliver Staples of Deyon also is reported wounded.

Marysville Man Killed

Private Milton Clegg son of Mr. and Mrs. Lemuel Clegg of Marysville is reported killed in action. Other casualties are Pte. Leslie MacDonald son of Mrs. John MacDonald wounded in the right arm and Pte. Raymond T. Pugh son of Mr. and Mrs. George Pugh of Nashwaaksis reported wounded in the left hand.
