### WIN-THE-WAR RECIPES.

These recipes are issued by the Fredericton Food Control Committee.

#### Oatmeal Cookies.

2½ cups oatmeal,  
2½ cups flour,  
1 cup sugar,  
1 cup shortening,  
1 small teaspoon soda dissolved in 1 cup hot milk,  
Flavoring.

Cream sugar and shortening, add hot milk and soda and flour and oatmeal. Roll thin and bake.

#### Mock Sausage.

Lima beans, dried, ½ cup.  
Bread crumbs, one-third cup.  
Butter, 3 tablespoons.  
Salt, ¼ teaspoon.  
Pepper, a few grains.  
Sage, ½ to ¾ teaspoon.

Pick over and wash beans, cover with water, let soak over night; drain, cook in boiling salted water until tender (about 1½ hours). Rub through a strainer, add remaining ingredients. Shape into form of sausages, roll in crumbs, egg and crumbs again. Saute in fat until brown. It requires about two-thirds of a cup of bread crumbs and half an egg for dipping sausages. May be garnished with fried apple.

Recipe makes 4 large sausages; approximate cost, 12c. Tested by Miss Peacock.
