London, Dec. 20.—The London correspondent of the Manchester Guardian suggests that President Wilson's sudden determination to come to England is due to his desire to consult the British government regarding the Russian situation before the preliminaries to the peace conference. The correspondent points to the presence in London of former Premier Kerensky and Paul Milukoff, former Russian foreign minister and leader of the constitutional democrats. He also calls attention in this connection to Wednesday's statement by Viscount Milner, Secretary of War, on the Russian situation, which he says was "evidently intended to prepare the public for events to come."

Rumors of an advanced policy in regard to Russia are growing daily, and feeling not only in labor quarters but in commercial quarters too has become very tense about our next adventure in Russia. The impetus of the Allied movement is believed to come from London, not Paris. The share which the United States must take in any big attempt to overthrow the Bolsheviks and reconstruct Russia—if she takes a further share—must be a large one.

SMALL, BUT THE REAL GOODS

Philadelphia, Dec. 17.—Many cherished traditions of the army have perished in the war, but one of the most deeply ingrained customs has been fractured by Joseph R. Zinnie of this city.

The "Top Sarge" usually is the biggest, hardest man in the outfit. It is he who gets the company up for reveille, drives out the details, chooses "K. P.'s" and is the prime disciplinarian. Custom has it that the first sergeant is the biggest man of the clan.

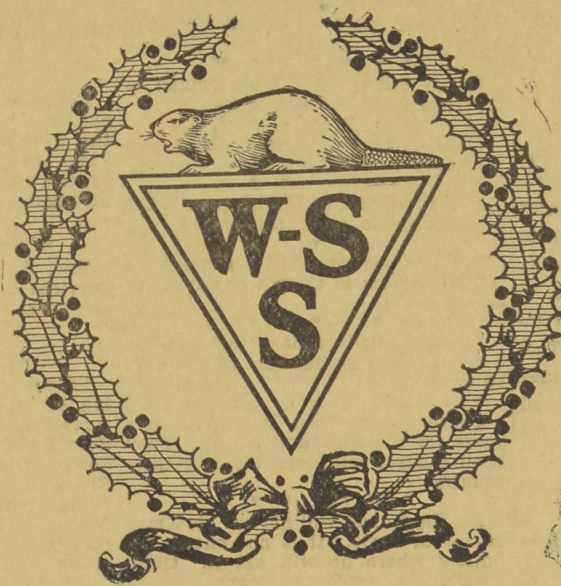

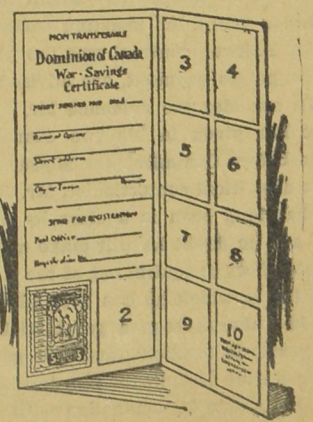
Fill in the name and address of your friend, of your boy, girl, or other person for whom your gift is intended, and there you have the most desirable of gifts!
