## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

HOW ABOUT A POTATO DAY?

Alabama Potatoes.

Boil eight medium sized potatoes in their skins until they can easily be pierced with a fork, drain, and set back on stove to dry out. Peel the potatoes and serve hot with the following sauce: One tablespoonful of wheat flour blended with two tablespoonfuls of butter, adding, as it melts three tablespoonfuls of water. Allow mixture to come to a boil, remove from the fire and stir in the yolk of one egg, beaten until light. Then add two tablespoonfuls of vinegar and pour the sauce over the hot boiled potatoes.

Potato Puff Balls.

Boil potatoes and mash them very smooth, using five or six medium sized potatoes for this recipe. Add to the mashed potatoes one tablespoonful of melted butter and one tablespoonful of chopped parsley, one tablespoonful of minced onion. Beat the yolks of three eggs and stir into potato mixture. Form into balls and throw them into fast boiling water for two minutes. Remove from boiling water and brush the balls with white of egg, roll in fine bread crumbs or cornmeal and fry in vegetable oil or oleomargarine. Potato puff balls are delicious served with fish or boiled meat.

Potato Doughnuts.

Cream four tablespoonfuls of butter with one cupful of sugar, stir in two well beaten eggs and one cupful mashed potatoes and one cupful of milk, 3 teaspoonfuls baking powder and enough whole wheat flour to make a soft dough. Roll into sheet one-half inch thick. Cut out doughnuts and fry in corn oil or other vegetable fat.

### DISHWASHING REMINDERS.

Use two pans, one for washing, filled with hot soapy water, the other for rinsing, filled with clear hot water.

Use a clean dish cloth and plenty of clean dry towels. Always use fresh towels for glass or silver.

Wash cleanest dishes first; glass, cups and saucers, pitchers and all fine china, fruit plates, etc. Take fresh, hot, soapy water for silver.

Do not put many dishes at one time in the pan. A large amount of soap or soap powder is likely to destroy all gilt and coloring on finely ornamented china.

Very fine china and cut glass should not be washed in very hot water. Rinse in water of same temperature as that
