## CANADIANS CARRYING ON

With the Canadian Forces, Oct. 20

Livesay, Canadian Press Correspondent) Good work has been done by the Canadian independent forces of motor machine gunners and cyclist corps, who, pushing out east along roads, except on our right around Bouchain, which the enemy had made the pivot of his withdrawal, found the resistance offered was not very formidable. A fringe of machine gunners had been left by the Germans of whom a certain number were captured. Touch was maintained with the enemy throughout the day, but it is quite possible his main force is miles away east. Owing to the continued dense fog turning into rain it has been impossible to take aerial photo-

graphs or to do air scouting. We have gone fifteen miles forward in the past two days. Practically all the blind lusk is all on the side of the Germans. Our difficulties are accentuated by the large number of craters blown by the enemy throughout the territory recaptured and the many bridges destroyed. In repairing these we have had the willing help of ten or twelve thousand civilians, released by our advance. Everywhere the villages are welcoming our troops with manifestations of joy.

The Canadian Red Cross is rushing up lorry loads of comforts for the affected population. It is merely guess work as to whether the enemy intends to hold Valenciennes. If he does we are now on the western fringe of the great forest of Vieoigne, which would be a natural line of defense.
