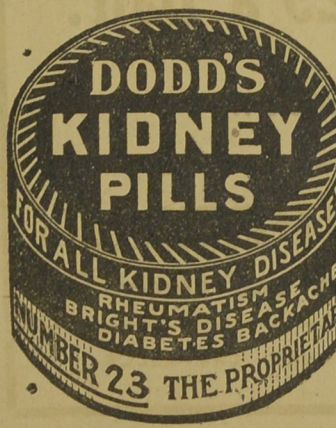

NEW WAYS TO USE CUCUMBERS.

Cucumbers in Gravy.

Take half a dozen medium-sized cucumbers and cut into thick slices, place in ice water, let stand a half hour, drain, simmer in unseasoned beef stock until tender. Skim out cucumbers and lay them in a hot vegetable dish. Cook tablespoon of browned corn flour in tablespoon of butter, add the stock, stir until thick and smooth, season with teaspoon of kitchen salt, season with onion juice, pepper and salt. Pour the sauce over cucumbers before serving.

Baked Cucumbers.

Peel and cut three medium cucumbers in halves lengthwise and remove seeds. Mix one cup of cooked veal, two tablespoons of ham and tablespoon of parsley finely chopped, and add three tablespoons of cream, one-half teaspoon of onion juice and pepper and salt to taste. Fill the cucumbers with the mixture, place them in a baking pan, pour in one cup of stock to which one tablespoon of lemon juice has been added and bake until tender, basting frequently. Remove to a heated dish, sprinkle with browned bread crumbs and pour the liquor from the pan over the mixture.

More Sugar Must be Saved.

There is no question about it—more sugar must be saved in the homes.

Candy manufacturers have had their sugar allowance cut by 50 per cent. Bakers and cake and biscuit manufacturers have all had restrictions put upon them. Limitations have been placed on private holdings of sugar.

These measures have been as effective as was expected. But more is asked of the individual in the way of voluntary denial. That is to say, let us be sparing with the sugar bowl. We want all we can get for the canning season. It will help if we stop taking sugar in tea or coffee—at least confine ourselves to one small teaspoonful. It will also help if we cut in half our customary allowance on fruit, cereals and desserts. It will not hurt any of us to do with less.

Some Ills and Their Cures.

The insect world is at its busiest these days in the war garden, and it is important that the pests be given attention just as soon as they appear. Delay in spraying may prove fatal.

The following may help the war gardener to make the best of his best crop:

Leaf Spot (red and purple spots, turning to ash gray)—Remedy: Spray with Bordeaux mixture when plants are 3 to 4 inches high, repeating two and four weeks later.

Worm (eats leaves)—Remedy: Spray with arsenate of lead when the worms appear; repeat when necessary.

Spinach aphid (sucks sap from the leaves)—Remedy: Spray with nicotine sulphate when pests appear, and repeat when necessary.

Beetroot aphid (Sucks sap from the roots)—Remedy: Pour a small amount of nicotine sulphate spray around the roots and repeat if necessary.

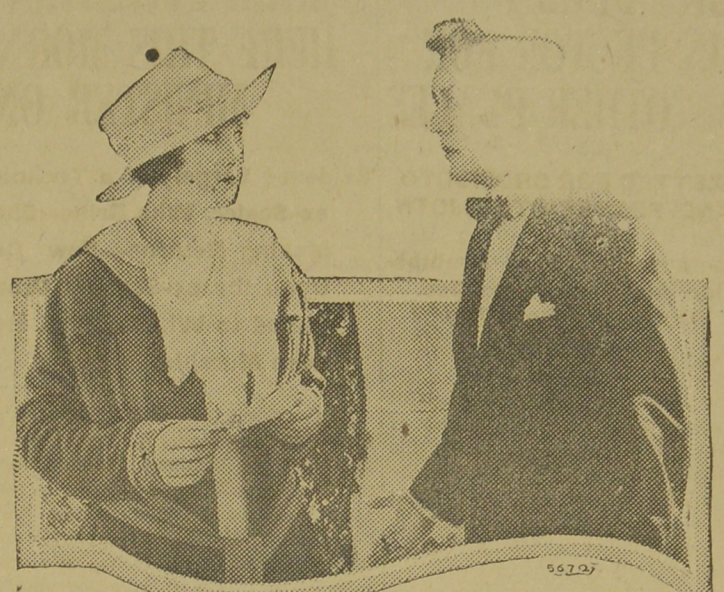
