

PROVINCES TO CO-OPERATE ON PRODUCTION

Ottawa, Feb. 12.—The conference of prime ministers on Friday will be the event of importance at the capital this week. The deliberations will have a far reaching effect on Canada's exertions to aid the war efforts of Great Britain and her allies by increasing food production. The chief purpose of the gathering will be to make plans whereby provincial machinery will co-operate to the fullest extent in carrying out the plans of the Dominion government. A number of ideas will be considered on Friday and a decision reached as to the best lines on which to proceed.

The announcement that the position of food controller has been abolished and a Canada food board established is but the preliminary to the adoption of a Dominion-wide appeal, calling for the greatest possible exertion on the part of the Dominion and Provincial governments.

Subsequent to the gatherings, a comprehensive announcement of government policy will be forthcoming.

The Canadian food board will constitute a sub-department of agriculture and will be under the personal direction of Hon. T. A. Crerar. It will co-ordinate with problems of food production and food conservation and remove the possibility of friction which would exist had the control of food been under a separate organization.

The treaty, however, is regarded as very instructive as to what a German peace may mean, and in this connection it is pointed out that the people of neither contracting party have been consulted; that the damages resulting from the war are not to be indemnified; that the Germans have carefully avoided fixing the date for the evacuation of the occupied territory; that the Germans have reserved means for furthering their imperial ambitions in Asia; that they have virtually suppressed liberty of exchange, and that by excluding the republic of the Ukraine from the advantages of the Austrian guarantees to Germany, the treaty suppresses the idea of the equality of nations.

"It is the beginning of an attempted realization of middle Europe," says the Temps, referring to the article in which Ukraine is excluded from the advantages guaranteed by any one of the coalition of the central empires to another.

Philadelphia, Feb. 12.—Sir Evariste LeBlanc, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, was operated upon at the University hospital here yesterday, for a disease of the eye. The operation was very successful, according to Major Pelletier, aide de camp to the Lieutenant Governor, who said that the patient's speedy recovery is expected. Major Pelletier said the report that Lieutenant Governor LeBlanc had undergone an operation several days ago were erroneous, and that it had not been decided to operate until yesterday. Madame LeBlanc and her daughter who were summoned here Saturday are at Sir Evariste's bedside.



THE BRITISH NAVY.

BUT WHAT WILL SHELLS COST?

(Philadelphia Inquirer.) Philadelphia householders may have to burn bituminous coal mixed with oyster shells, to keep warm during the remainder of the winter. Owing to the extreme shortage in anthracite, and to alleviate the intense suffering among the great mass of Philadelphians from lack of fuel, Francis A. Lewis, coal administrator for the city, declared that plans were being discussed for the introduction of bituminous coal into households here. The oyster shells should be used, according to the soft coal dealers, to prevent its "clinking."
