A HEALTHY COMPLEXION.

Protecting the Skin Against the Elements is Quite Proper.

A certain well known woman who drives her car continually in the service of the government, declared that the secret of her clear smooth complexion lay in the frequency and in the manner of her cold cream applications, says an exchange. It is safe to say that before sallying forth to breast the elements, and this applies to diving, swimming, boating and walking as well, one should plaster the face with cold cream and powder. An absolute paste may be put on in this manner, and it will not show if it is done with care. Rub in with the finger tips a foundation of cold cream, then with a puff dust powder over this and with a soft cloth rub in the cosmetic lightly If at the end of a few minutes the grease shows in places, repeat the powder rubbing treatment until a smooth finish has been made. This will withstand the most direct assault of sun or wind, and if it is removed after returning from the out of doors there is no danger of the skin receiv ing an overdose of cream. To remove this makeup use, instead of clear water, a solution of borax and alcohol. Either will cut the grease.

MORE SANDWICHES.

Tomato Jelly Sandwich.

This is one of the best of summer Flake cooked fish into andwiches. mall pieces and marinate in French dressing. Prepare the tomato jelly from one-fourth of a package of gelatine softened in one-fourth of a cupful of cold water. Dissolve in half a cupful of boiling water and add one cupful and a half of chili sauce. Set aside to chill and harden. Between slices of oatmeal or bran bread place a layer of the jelly, one of the drained flaked fish, spread with mayonnaise or boiled dressing and a bit of grated horseradish. A very small quantity of fish can be used, and a leaf of lettuce or a little shredded parsley added to give bulk to the filling.

French Cabbage Sandwich.

Use one-quarter of a small new cab bage and let it stand in ice water to chill. Drain, dry carefully, discard the hard centre and shred finely. Mix the cabbage with half a green pepper freed from seeds and chopped, two chopped hard-boiled eggs and two tablespoon fuls of shredded parsley. Moisten with a boiled dressing to which a table spoonful of chutney has been added and spread between thinly buttered slices of potato bread or thin biscuit.


Potato Sandwich.


