

WIN-THE-WAR RECIPES.

These recipes are issued by the
Fredericton Food Control Committee.

Potato Soup.

Serves 6 cups.

- 4 medium potatoes.
- 1 small sliced onion.
- 1 quart water.
- 2 tablespoons drippings.
- 2 tablespoons flour.
- 1 pint hot milk.
- 1 teaspoon salt.
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper.
- 1 teaspoon chopped parsley.

Cook potatoes, washed, pared and
sliced with onion, in water until po-
tatoes are soft. Rub through strainer
without draining from water. Mix fat
and flour, add to potato water. Cook
one minute. Add hot milk and sea-
sonings.

Rye Bread.

- 2 cups scalded milk.
- 2 tablespoons butter.
- 1 tablespoon sugar.
- 3 cups flour.
- 2 teaspoons salt.
- 1/2 yeast cake dissolved in
3/4 cup lukewarm water.
- 3 cups rye flour.

Put butter, sugar and salt in mixing
bowl, add scalding milk and when
lukewarm add dissolved yeast cake
and white flour. Let rise to a spongy
consistency, add rye flour and bread.
Let rise again and shape into loaves or
rolls. Place in greased pans, let rise
until double in bulk, and bake.

Buckwheat Drop Cakes.

- 1/2 cup butterine.
- 1/2 cup sugar.
- 2 eggs.
- 1/4 cup of milk.
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice.
- 3/4 cup buckwheat.
- 1/2 cup white flour.
- 2 teaspoons baking powder.
- Salt.
- Chopped nuts, or raisins or
dates.

Combine as cake; drop by teaspoons
on a well greased baking sheet two
inches apart. Bake 15 minutes in a
moderate oven.

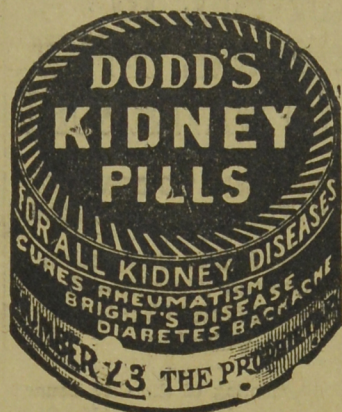

NORWEGIAN SHIPS SUNK

(Canadian Press direct wire.)
Washington, D. C., Mar. 4. — Nor-
way continues to suffer heavily from
German submarine operations and
other war losses. Twelve vessels, ag-
gregating 16,231 tons, and valued at
about \$3,000,000 was sunk during Feb-
ruary and nineteen seamen lost their
lives, while twenty men are missing,
a cablegram to the Norwegian lega-
tion today announced.

MONTENEGRIN PRINCE DEAD

Amsterdam, March 4.—Prince Mir-
kow, second son of King Nicholas of
Montenegro, died in a sanitarium at
Vienna Sunday of hemorrhage of the
lungs.

Prince Mirkow, who was 32 years
old, remained in Montenegro after the
royal family fled from the Austrian in-
vaders. He attempted to enter into
separate peace negotiations with Aus-
tria, but his efforts were of no avail.

BUSINESS MEN TAKE ACTION

New York, March 4.—The American
Ruselian Chamber of Commerce, re-
presenting American business men,
who have important commercial inter-
ests in Russia, adopted a resolution to-
day setting forth its belief, "that the
invasion of eastern Russian territory
by any military forces might produce
harmful economic results, unless such
action was the result of formal agree-
ments between all the Allied powers,
and provided that such invasion was
preceded by wide publicity clearly set-
ting forth its purpose."
The resolution was sent to Secre-
tary Lansing.
